NEW YORK (AP)—Novelist Pearl S. Buck, has for years been writing books under a man's name as well as her own, it was learned Wednesday.

Miss Buck acknowledged that she is author of works under the nom de plume, John Sedges. She said she used the name on some volumes to avoid literary type-

casting.

Most of Miss Buck's major novels have a Chinese locale or oriental overtones. The Sedges books have an American setting. "I wanted to do something completely different and I wanted to make sure it would be accepted on its own merits," she said, adding that she thought an unknown male would have a better chance being accepted than an unknown female.

The first Sedges book, The Townsman, published 13 years ago, was well received by critics.

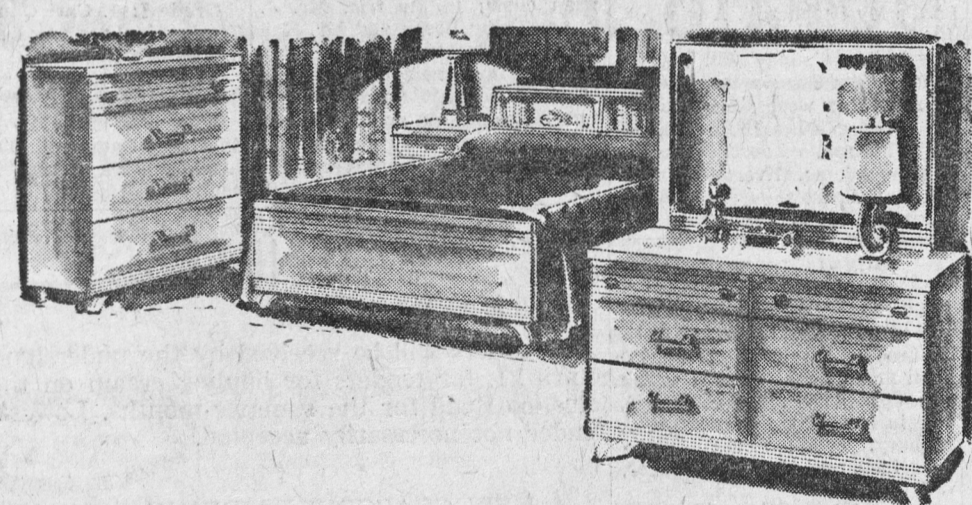
