**Tenders for a Sailing packet between  
Charlottetown, Shediac and  
Cascumpec.**

SEALED TENDERS will be received at this Office until Thursday, the 20th day of May next, at 12 o'clock, noon, from any person or persons being willing to furnish the Government with a fast-sailing, staunch, substantial Vessel, of not less than 50 tons burden, O. M., having good cabin accommodations for passengers, and being sufficiently manned, and fully and properly equipped and appareled, and subject in all things to the approval of the Government. The said Vessel to be required to run once a fortnight between the ports of Charlottetown, Shediac, and Cascumpec, from the first day of June next, until the 31st day of December, or the close of the navigation in the present year, 1869.

The Tender is required to name the age, tonnage, rig and accommodations of the vessel tendered, and also the sum which the tender will engage to perform the whole term of service for; and further, also, the names of two persons of known responsibility, who will become bound for the due performance of the service. All freight and passage money to be the property of the owner of the vessel. The Tender is required to express on its cover; "Tender for Charlottetown, Shediac and Cascumpec Packet Service."

The Government is not bound to accept the lowest Tender.

**In the Insolvent Debtors Court.**

32nd Vic., A. D. 1869.

HIS Honor the Judge or Commissioner, has been pleased to make the following further orders and rules therein, viz:—

7th. That his Honor may, from time to time, extend the Term of Protection that may be granted to an Insolvent Debtor, under the Eleventh Section of "The Unfortunate Debtors' Act, 1868," beyond the time of four calendar months, as specified in the said section, in the same way as set forth by the Fifty-fourth section of the said Act, in cases of appeal, *id est*, by endorsing on the original certificate of Protection, a memorandum to that effect, and the same shall be in force during the time that the certificate shall be so extended, unless it be suspended by order of the Judge or Commissioner of the said Court.

8th. Whenever any amendments are allowed by his Honor, to the Schedules on file in this Honorable Court, they shall be written, signed and attested by the Petitioner, on a separate paper, in the same manner as the original Schedules were signed and verified, on the oath of the Petitioner.
