Mrs. Don Seaman's game Just Betty's Mark made a race of it all the way and was clocked in 2:06-2, by far the greatest performance ever given by the Seaman gelding.

THERE WAS quite a wind blowing Monday night when Mighty Lee turned on the heat. Race fans were wishing it had been a real hot afternoon and that the big pacer was in the same mood for racing. A whole lot of folks were expressing the opinion that had conditions been right the track record would have been licked then and there.

Never have local race fans witnessed the calibre of racing that is being served up to them this season. Horses are going all the way and new records are becoming commonplace. The quality of horses at Charlottetown Driving Park has certainly kept pace with the quantity and this summer should see the local racing strip far outclass any other Maritime track.

WE HAVE the cream of the horses in the Maritimes right here with us. They can stay here all summer, get plenty of races and the purses are attractive. There seems no good reason why any of them should decide to race in an other centre for any period of time.

During the months of July and August, three races a week will be held but even at that race secretary and classifier Frank "Duck" Acorn will have his hands full taking care of everybody.  
 And so it shapes up like the most terrific racing season you could wish for. The judges intend to see to it that the rules are strictly enforced and all drivers will be all-out or those on the sulky will be given a rest from their chores. They want good drivers from wire to wire and if any driver doesn't want to co-operate, the men in the stand are going to try someone else in his place.

The betting public don't mind losing a few dollars if the horse of their choice is given a fair shake. However, they will growl loud and long if they see lack of effort on the part of some drivers.

**SUMMERSIDE RACEWAY** made an impressive return to the harness racing game last night.  
 The Dominion Day (this time it was night) races drew a large crowd and the folks who were on hand had themselves a right good night. The nine-dash card was run off in an efficient manner, and the quality of the dashes was of a high order.

The new management certainly has gone about its work in earnest. They have restored order out of chaos as far as the raceway is concerned. The attractive plant, opened in 1953, has been inactive for some time and during that interval just about everything about the place had been wrecked. It was a sorry sight when the twenty new owners took over but they faced the task in a hurry and got things in shape in short order.

Races will be held again at the Raceway in Lobster Carnival Week and, we understand, on Labour Day. The new owners intend to make all these cards a big success and will leave nothing undone to satisfy horsemen and race patrons.

It's nice to see the Raceway alive once more and to think now there is somebody who intends to see to it that destruction doesn't continue at this popular amusement centre.  
 Summerside Raceway is a big asset to Summerside and the new operators are to be congratulated on their work to date. Here's wishing them the best of everything.

 Paul Foytack worked on a one-hitter for better than seven innings in Detroit Wednesday, but ran into gopher-ball trouble in the late going and required ninth-inning help from Ray Narleski before the Tigers subdued Kansas City Athletics 5-4.  
 The game was twice stalled by rain.

Neil Chrissy tied the game for Detroit with a fourth-inning homer off Tiger starter Ned Garver. The Tigers got to Garver and John Kucka for four runs in the seventh and a 5-1 lead before that late rally by the A's.  
 The story in Chicago was similar but in this case, the Cubs made the late rally stick.

**RELIEFER LOSES**  
 After scoring four runs in the eighth to fashion a 5-5 standoff, the Cubs saddled relief pitcher Lindy McDaniel with his ninth loss by scoring the winning run with one out in the ninth.

In the National League rain held away in Cincinnati, and the Reds' game with Milwaukee was postponed.

Chicago Cubs tallied five runs in the last two innings to score a 6-5 come-from-behind victory over St. Louis Cardinals in Chicago.

The only other National League contest was a night game involving Pittsburgh and Philadelphia. Three night contests were carded in the American League, New York at Baltimore, Boston at Washington and Chicago at Cleveland.

**AN EARLY SIGN**
