NEWS FROM BERLIN.

THE EMPEROR'S CONDITION The Doctors Anxious.

It is still hoped that the Emperor may rally. The doctors are anxious on account of his declining strength. Last night he had a serious fainting fit, the second during his illness. After midnight he lay in a doze. The doctors were unable to wake him until late in the afternoon. Late in the evening he asked for food, and partaking, felt refreshed. It is stated that in addition to the kidney affections, the Emperor is suffering from intense pains, due to inflammation of the parts affected by rupture. Morphia was administered to alleviate the pain, but was too much for his strength, and was discontinued. The doctors do not leave him a moment. Great excitement prevailed in the palace all day. The official bulletins state that the Crown Prince passed a good night. He has an excellent appetite.

DOMINION PARLIAMENT DEBATES AND PROCEEDINGS.

OTTAWA, March 7. In the House of Commons to-day, Sir Hector Langevin in reply to Mr. Perry, said that it was not the intention of the Government to place any sum in the estimates for the purpose of improving communication with Prince Edward Island or of fulfilling the Terms of Union with that Province.

A Terrible Calamity.

SPRINGFIELD, MASS., March 7. The new office of the Evening Union was burnt out this forenoon. The blaze was attended with the most sickening sorrow ever witnessed in the city. Eight employes met a terrible death by jumping from the fifth story, and being crushed into a shapeless mass below. Five others were badly injured. The fire was first discovered in the mailing room, and shot up an old elevator in the rear, cutting off escape by the stairway. Most of the employes who escaped found their way to the ground by a roof in the rear.

The Inter-Provincial Resolutions.

TORONTO, March 7. The Inter-Provincial resolutions which have been debated in the Local Legislature for some days, were adopted this morning by a vote of 54 to 30. A resolution was also carried, requesting the Lieutenant-Governor to communicate the concurrence of the House in the resolutions to the Imperial Government.

Southern Russia has taken to cultivating tobacco, for which the climate and soil are admirably adapted.
Four acres of grain were sown at Moose Jaw, Assiniboia Territory, by Mr. Charles Young, on January 27.

The Emperor of China is going to sell all honorary ranks in his empire, and he expects to raise 4,000,000 taels in four months.
According to the Scottish News, great numbers of Irish cows, many over twenty years of age, are used up for sausages in Glasgow.
Pleurisy-pneumonia has again secured a firm hold among the cattle of Aberdeenshire and fresh cases are being reported every day.
