

Miners Defeat Islanders 3-1 To Move Within Three Points Of Second Place

GLACE BAY, N. S. (CP) — Glace Bay Miners moved to within three points of second place in the Maritime Major Hockey League by defeating Charlottetown Islanders 3-1 here Wednesday night.

Miners, who trail Sydney Millionaires, increased their third-place lead over Charlottetown to eight points.

Scoring single goals in the first and second periods, Miners stayed ahead all the way. Jim Farrell opened the scoring on a play with George Whyte and Copper Leyte. Bill Needham teamed with Farrell and Gordon Myles for the second goal, and Leyte passed to Gordie Miller for the final score.

Vic Palladino scored the lone Charlottetown goal on a play with Paul Sandton and Bob Gray.

After a tame first period, play got tougher in the second and in the opening minutes, Farrell and Bucko Trainer of Islanders tangled in a free swinging brawl that cost them both majors. Farrell was given an additional minor for high sticking Trainer.

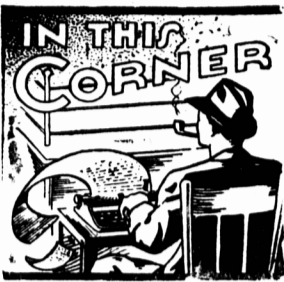
