Lancaster Bombers Leave S'side Airport For Retirement

SUMMERSIDE — The last three Lancaster aircraft at RCAF Station, Summerside will leave tonight at midnight for Calgary where they will be retired and placed in storage.

After the last war when RCAF Station, Summerside became a navigation school the "Lanc" played an important part in carrying the students on long range flights which was a necessary

part of their training. The "Zenith" and "Polaris" were well known Lancaster aircraft locally a few years ago, having carried out several long distance flights into the Arctic and overseas.

When the station was converted to Maritime Command Lancasters were the main aircraft in use but gradually in the past couple of years they have been replaced by Neptunes and now by the new Argus.

However Lancasters have not been retired completely from the RCAF, although they will not be used in Maritime operations. Several of the famous aircraft, which played a very prominent part in bombing operations during the Second World War, are still in use for search and rescue and photographic use.

ALBERTON — Spreading grass fires resulted in four separate calls for the Alberton Fire Department yesterday afternoon.

The first alarm occurred about two o'clock when a fire went out of control on Church Street near the Presbyterian Church grounds. Shortly after the firemen were called to Main Street where a barn near Everett MacDonald's property was threatened.

S'side Police Hunting Stolen Dynamite Sticks

SUMMERSIDE — Fourteen sticks of dynamite stolen some-

time after Friday afternoon from its storage location on the M. F. Schurman Co. Ltd property on the MacEwen Road in Summerside is the object of a search by Summerside police.

Fear has been expressed that loss of life or injury to persons and property might occur with disastrous results if it should be detonated by an inexperienced person, either accidentally or with purpose.

To steal the dynamite the intruders broke through a fence that encloses the property and forced the padlock on the door of the

strongly built structure.

An addition to the intruders also stole a list of precautions to be taken in handling the explosive, and a copy of the firms permit to store dynamite in the building.

A company spokesman said that if one stick of the dynamite should be exploded its force could detonate all of the other sticks that were nearby, and in expressing concern for the danger that existed from the misuse of the dynamite, urgently requested any person with knowledge of the whereabouts of the stolen dynamite to make its location known to the police or the company without delay.

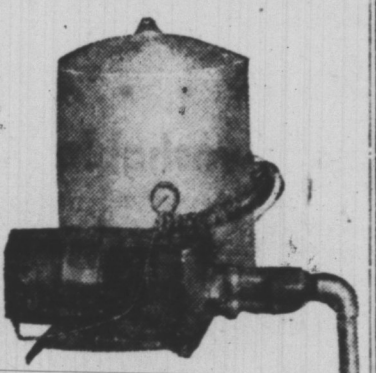

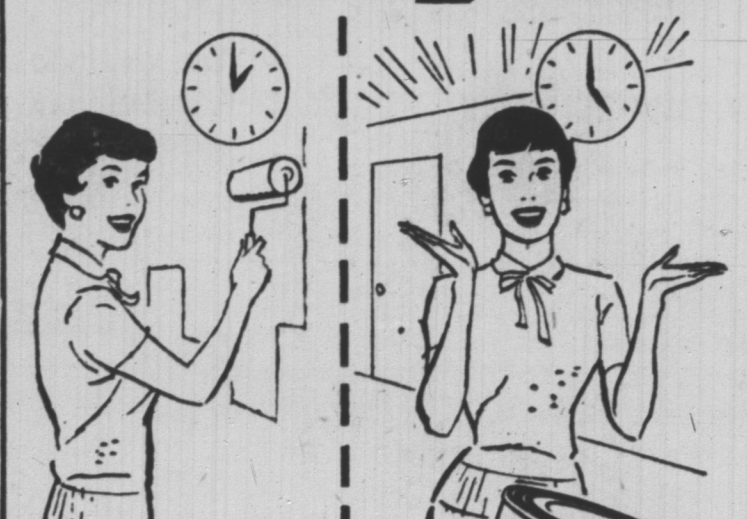
