## S.R.LAYCOCK BURSARY

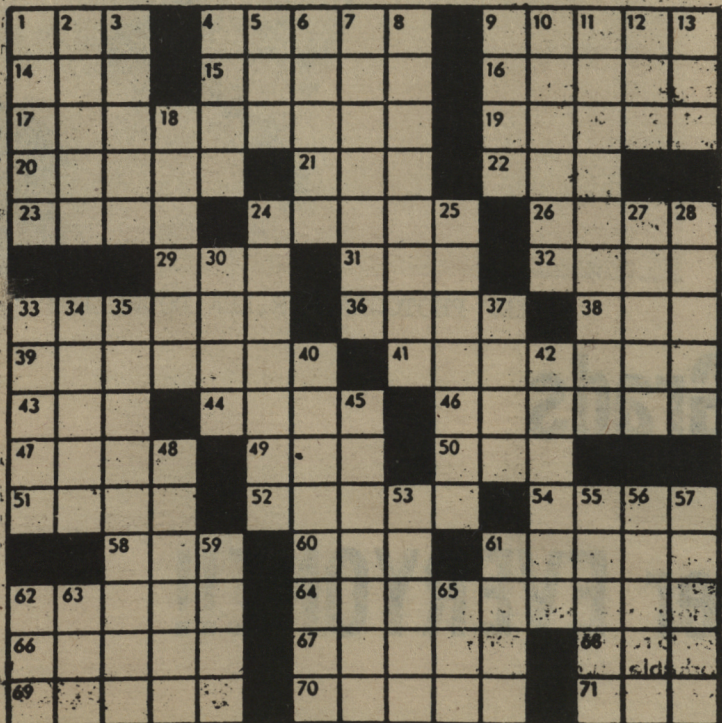
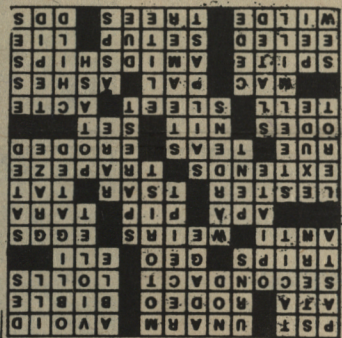

Yes, I met some great people who had something intelligent to say. It's quite a change from high school. It's really good if you're interested in books.



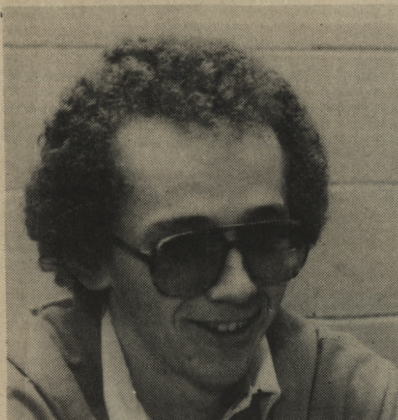
Marty Hilton-Soph
