No Confidence Vote May Bring Down French Gov't

PARIS, (Reuters)—The French government faced a Socialist non-confidence motion which could bring an end to the seven-month regime of Premier Edgar Faure as the French National Assembly entered the second day of its crucial debate on Algeria. The Socialist motion said that only a completely new policy with new aims and methods could reestablish calm in the troubled French North African territory, assure the continued presence of France there, and provide for the development of democracy. It rejected any moves toward "integration," and declared that the 1947 statute which made Algeria part of metropolitan France had only been applied in fragmentary fashion.

 As a result, it said, the Algerian people were skeptical of the

value of the statute. The Socialist motion came Wednesday as important modifications were being shaped in Faure's policy for the territory. Interior Minister Maurice Bourges-Manoury told the assembly these would include limited local self-government in the form of elected Algerian councils and a comprehensive irrigation plan to spur economic betterment for Algerians. The minister rejected the idea of an Algerian republic associated with France. He said such an autonomy might develop into secession.

WOULD BE CITIZENS
 Bourges-Manoury said the new charter would keep the provision making all Algerians French citizens and the whole territory as a group of departments forming an integral part of France.

Widespread opposition to further integration with France among Algerian nationalist leaders has resulted in demands for complete independence, backed by a systematic campaign of terrorism in Algeria. About 120,000 French troops are presently tied down fighting the terrorists. Meanwhile, the Faure plan for reforms in the French protectorate of Morocco moved toward reality. The key point in the reforms—the setting up of a Moroccan regency council as a step toward eventual self-government—will be implemented before Sunday.

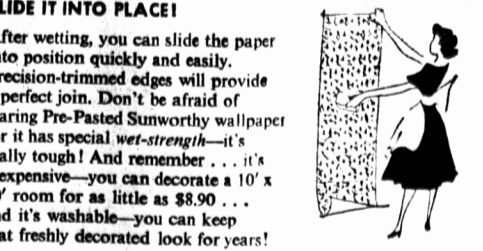
