## ALL ARE SUMMONED TO PRAYER, PENANCE

Our Divine Lord prepared for His Passion by His prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane. That prayer was an expression of His human fear, the need he felt for His Father's strengthening help, and His absolute surrender to His Father's Will.

The season of Lent is the period of 40 days during which we share, or rather continue, the Passion of Our Lord. And as Christ by His suffering and death merited for us the grace of the resurrection, we should share more fully in His suffering, merit an increased share in the grace, the Divine Life, which He won for us on the Cross.

Christ, Son of God, prayed during His Passion, and His prayers expressed not only need, but also love and confidence. And the Church during Lent urges all Christians to share more fully in the prayer of Christ, that prayer by which we place ourselves before God as we are, needy and poor, dependent on His mercy; but at the same time, our prayer is confident, joyful, a prayer of adoration and love.

### DEBATING TEAM

This week began in quite a flurry of activity, at least in some circles, as the debating team went into their windup, drawing many of their associates into the vortex of their feverish activities as they prepared to enter into the regional final match, the whole program was by this time moving double-time as the two debaters, Ian Gillies, and Leo Peddie tried to cram adequate research on the resolution to be handled at the meet into the three days that were allotted before the encounter which would decide the maritime champions. To further complicate matters, the team had to devote themselves to both sides of the resolution, that international rivalry still holds more promises than threats for the future of mankind. The sides weren't decided until the night before the two stalwarts departed for the mainland. To hasten the research program, a panel discussion was staged in which the topic was thoroughly aired. The debaters conscripted a veritable army of research material and placed them at strategic points around the discussion table to gather in the fragments as the great minds commenced to dissect the topic. Following this operation, the debaters and their scribes thoroughly screened their material and far into the night a battery of typewriters rent the air with the birth-wail of the speeches upon which the Saints were depending in order to sweep the field in this last encounter before the dominion final match in Ontario. Unfortunately, the fates had other plans. Finally the day of reckoning arrived, last Tuesday and after close to a twelve hour trip, the debaters arrived in Halifax. By this time, the fabric of their fitness was wearing pretty thin, and thoroughly wearied of mind and body, so fatigued by their strenuous preparations and the long trip that even the judges noticed it, they arrived to find that Dalhousie had two budding lawyers stacked up against them. The result themselves were most discouraging. Dalhousie won the debate hands down, with Fr. F. and Dr. H. Corston rendering the decision. The boys returned in a surprising state of composure, confident that the better team was now in a position to represent the maritimes in the dominion debating finals at London Ontario, the final round of which, by the way, was scheduled for today. Perhaps it was expecting too much for a rookie team, as Saint Dunstan's has this year, to reach the final

## Pro-Adenauer Party Planned

BONN, Germany, (AP)—Sixteen ranking members of the Free Democrat party bolted Thursday night and said they will form a new pro-Adenauer party.

The 16, all members of Parliament and including four cabinet ministers, blasted the Free Democrats' action in joining Socialists to oust state Premier Karl Arnold in the North Rhine-Westphalia three days ago.

The Free Democrats and Socialists formed a new government in North Rhine-Westphalia which excluded Chancellor Adenauer's Christian Democrat party. The action imperilled Adenauer's grip in the federal Upper House, whose members are chosen by state legislatures.

The North Rhine-Westphalia defeat for the 80-year-old chancellor sparked gleeful opposition predictions that Adenauer's era was ending. The walkout helped repair Adenauer's position and weakened the Free Democrats in national politics.

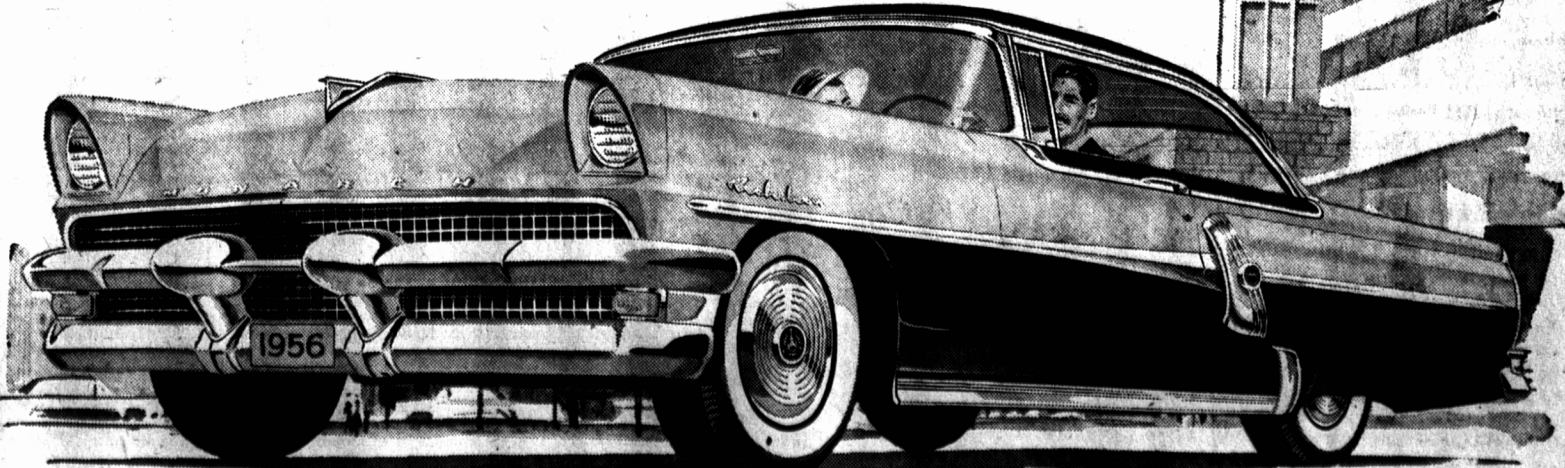

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# NEWSY NOTES

## A NEW SYSTEMIC INSECTICIDE

Systemic insecticides are those that penetrate the living plant cells and are carried in the sap stream. As the plant grows, the insecticides are carried throughout the entire body of the plant. Chemicals that have systemic action have also proven effective when applied to plant foliage. When sprayed or dusted on plants, they find their way through the tissues into the sap stream, they are thus carried into new growth and provide much longer control than the usual organic insecticides such as DDT. They are also absorbed by insects crawling on treated plants, when these insecticides penetrate the skin of the insect it is destroyed.

The chemical research team who pioneered malathion and parathion, in following up a series of organic phosphates, have compounded another insecticide which was known until recently under the code number of 3911. The Connecticut Research Laboratories have given this insecticide the name of THIMET. It has its base in the phosphate family of chemicals.

## THIMET

Thimet, like other systemic insecticides, is absorbed into the tissues of plants and does not in any way interfere with their normal growth. Like these insecticides it has proven very effective against sucking insect pests such as spider mites, aphids and thrips which live on the juices of plants. Among the amazing results reported by investigators in state and federal research stations, where cotton is grown, is that this new chemical when applied to cotton seed is absorbed by it, and becomes a part of or enters the seedling cotton plant in sufficient strength to destroy thrips, spider mites and aphids, that may attack it for several weeks; thus saving cotton growers in the Delta section of Texas and others, three or four dusts or spray applications that are usually necessary.

Thimet when applied to seeds, has given control against sucking insects which attack cotton plants and is the first insecticide that has proven satisfactory. Cotton growers in many districts have had severe losses of seedling plants, by heavy infestations of sucking insects.

## SEED TREATMENT

The treating of cotton seed with thimet proved to be a difficult pro-

position. The first trial was done by merely tumbling the dust and seed together in a drum. Even partially de-linted cotton seed is fuzzy and it was almost impossible to get the thimet dust to stick and penetrate the seed. When the cotton seed was sprayed with a thimet solution or dipped in it, much of the chemical was likely to volatilize and not soak in. Activated carbon, which had proved to be a satisfactory carrier of phosphate chemicals, was tried, and it held the thimet tightly and released it
