## Kennedy's Cabinet Split

### By French Nuclear Issue

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Kennedy is expected to overrule some of the military advisers who want to reverse U.S. policy and have the United States become a nuclear power.

The issue splits the Kennedy administration, but the president himself has been against any U.S. action that would tend to increase the number of nuclear weapons in Europe. In addition, they feel the NATO agreement offers about the only hope of solving the problem of nuclear weapons defence capability in NATO's European members.

Encouraging creation of an international — controlled NATO nuclear force.

Informed officials predicted Sunday that the president will stand firm on these policies and reject the advice he has received in favour of a change.

The occasion for a presidential review and decision results from a report made by Gen. Maxwell Taylor to the president last week.

MILITARY VIEWS

The president's special military adviser is said to have advocated that the United States should provide nuclear weapons to the French some nuclear weapons components.

The Taylor view is said to have coincided with the position on the French nuclear issue taken by the U.S. joint chiefs of staff.

Some informants said that substantially the same kind of advice has been given to the president by his ambassador to Paris, James M. Graham, a former military man. The position is reported to have received support also from Defence Secretary McNamara.
