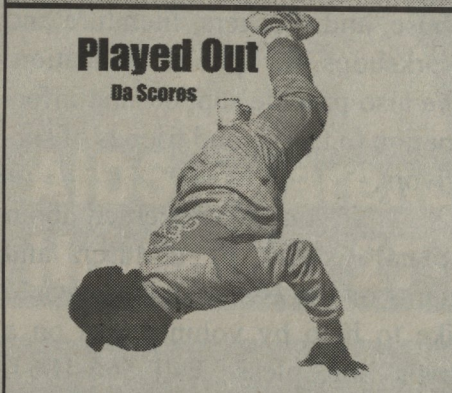
On the national scene, the Montreal Canadiens finally axed their head coach and general manager.
