**Standards Of Performance Suggested For Detergents**

OTTAWA (CP)—Members of the Senate Commons price committee suggested that the government should set standard performance criteria for soaps and detergents and require manufacturers to state publicly how their products measure up.

Senator C. W. Carter (L.-Nfld.) said the National Research Council should be able to prescribe a standard unit of cleaning power, although soap and detergent manufacturers say they have been unable to do so.

If there was such a standard, Senator Carter said, manufacturers could state on each package how many hundreds or thousands of units the contents contain. Housewives would then be able to compare price and value between one product and another.

George Williams, president and general manager of Procter and Gamble Co. of Canada Ltd., said if such a standard can be set, his company would go along with it.

**COMPLAIN ABOUT SIZES**

Mrs. Grace MacInnis (NDP—Vancouver-Kingsway) and Reid Scott (NDP—Toronto Danforth) complained about the odd-sized packaging in which tooth pastes are sold—1 1/2-ounce, 5/8-ounce, and 3/8-ounce tubes.

Purchasers of Crest tooth

paste can save 20 per cent by buying the family-size tube in place of the smallest tube and 32 per cent by buying the largest size tube, said Mr. Williams.

"But the housewife doesn't know that, unless you tell her," Mr. Scott said.

"Based on the way our business is going," Mr. Williams said, "she jolly well does know it; she looks at the big tube and says there's a hell of a bargain. Sales of large sizes are growing."

He said that higher prices for soaps and detergents, on the retail market are clearly the result of price increases charged by retailers, not the manufacturers. The DRS index of soap and detergent industry selling prices was 114.9 in 1964 and 114.6 in September this year, he said.

"Don't you take any responsibility for the prices charged by retail stores?" Mrs. MacInnis asked.

"My dear," he replied, "we cannot do very much; we do not set retail prices and by law we cannot control retail prices."

Ron Basford (L.—Vancouver Burrard) said he had bought a tube of Crest for 76 cents in a discount store, though the package was marked \$1.19.

"That's a GEM-store," Mr. Williams said. "They're out of business."

**Canadian Defence Staff Chief Happy With Talks In London**

 LONDON (CP) — Gen. Jean Allard said Friday he had useful talks with British military leaders and was most happy with what "they have offered to us."

While the chief of the Canadian defence staff declined to elaborate, he spoke in the context of the problems the Canadian NATO brigade in West Germany would face if Britain decided to reduce its Army on the Rhine.

He said earlier that the 6,000-man brigade depends to some extent on British logistical support and a reduction by the British could affect Canadian operations.

After conferring Friday with Field Marshal Sir Richard Hull, chief of the British defence staff, and other service leaders, Allard said in an interview: "We still have a few problems

with our other partners but not with the British any more."

**DEMANDS ORDERS**

Britain has warned West Germany the 50,000-man British force would be reduced unless Germany increases purchases from Britain to balance the sterling spent on the army. The United States also has demanded more German orders. The issue now is being examined by a tripartite committee.

Allard said earlier that if Britain reduces its army, Canada would have to find more logistics support elsewhere or provide it from the Canadian establishment.

It appeared from Allard's remarks that he had received some assurance that the needs of the Canadian troops would get close attention even if the British trimmed forces.

Allard will fly to Paris Sunday for a five-day official visit of French military installations and discussions with French military leaders.

Among the topics will be the question of closing Canada's two air bases in France, at Metz and Marville, as demanded by President de Gaulle.

Allard said this will be a major problem since the Marville base not only supplies NATO with planes but also provides air transport for Canadian commitments in the Middle East and elsewhere.

He may seek French agreement to allow some Canadian air transport to remain in France on a permanent basis.

**Bid Made To Ease Taxes On Margarine**

OTTAWA (CP) — John C. Lockwood, president of Lever Brothers Ltd., said federal and provincial governments should repeal taxes and lift other marketing restrictions from margarine to bring the price down and let producers meet the butter shortage.

The present 11-per-cent federal sales tax adds 44 cents a pound to retail margarine prices, he said.

The dairy industry in Canada is unable to supply Canada's table and cooking fat needs, "despite a generous price support and subsidy program costing \$22 per family per year, or the equivalent of a week's grocery bill," Mr. Lockwood added.

"Once again government is faced with the necessity of importing butter. We are confident that we can provide a better answer than imported butter, provided the consumer is truly permitted to exercise her right to freedom of choice."

Removal of the federal sales tax would save Canadian consumers more than \$5,000,000 on their annual food bill, he said.

OAKVILLE, Ont. (CP) — If Robert MacBeth, 34, hadn't been wearing socks, he might not have been arrested on a charge of breaking entry and theft. Constable Roy Wilkinson testified Thursday that MacBeth was wearing the socks on his hands—when he was seen leaving St. Judge's Anglican Church in the middle of the night. MacBeth, who pleaded guilty to the charge and admitted stealing 90 cents from the church, was remanded to Dec. 15 for sentence.
