

Tests In New York After Series Of Negro Crimes

NEW YORK (AP)—A series of crimes by Negroes against whites in New York's streets and subways has the city on edge. Not terrified, but uneasy. There are some things that have happened recently, although one official says such a list could have been compiled any time in the last 20 years. A white woman was raped and killed in a self-service

The incidents are unconnected, sporadic and often sensational. The New York Times reports a Negro gang in Harlem whose sole object is killing whites. Harlem leaders say it doesn't exist.

In New York too is a "long hot summer" of racial violence.

Search Pressed To Missing Trio

PHILADELPHIA, Miss. (AP) Federal and state agencies pressed relentlessly about Monday for clues in the baffling disappearance of three young civil rights workers.

Farm posts were dragged. Motorists were questioned at a roadblock near the spot where the trio's chartered station wagon was found June 23.

The White House said the search was being expanded and intensified. President Johnson kept in touch with the situation.

For the first time, FBI began distributing in Mississippi and surrounding states pictures and descriptions of the missing youths—Andy Goodman, 20, and Michael Schwerner, 21, whites from New York. They were charged with a Negro from nearby Meridian.

Typhoon Winnie Slams Manila
