As Junior-Senior Business candidate for the Student Union, I would like to give my view on some topic of special interest to all Business students.

As most students know, Junior year is almost an impossible year, in which twenty four hours in a day are not enough in some cases, and the availability of summer school courses this year has done little to improve this.

In the past years, it was customary to offer at least one of accounting 200 or 300. This year no accounting courses are being offered. If I were this year's Sophomores, I would raise hell, for example next year Juniors will face the impossible challenge of trying to study such time consuming courses as accounting 300 Finance and Marketing which is a full year's course next year. These courses in my opinion are enough to keep any student busy, not considering his other courses. The summer school program this year has offered marketing, but it is to be a full year's course next academic year and if students want to lighten their load for Junior year, they will have to take both summer school sessions.
