GENERAL TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

El Paso, Texas, May 30.—The city council has passed an ordinance forbidding women from wearing on the streets a city what is known as the "divided skirt."

PARIS, May 30.—This being the anniversary of the death of Joan of Arc, deputations from several Missions lodged to-day in the large church of St. Etienne, upon the square of the Maid of Orleans in the Rue des Pyramides. The wreath was inscribed: "To Joan of Arc, abandoned by royalty, burned by the church." This inscription caused a riot. The wreath was seen by a number of young Catholics who gathered in a body and made a dash for the statue. The Masons had in the meantime assembled, and when the young Catholics removed the wreath and tore down the inscription there was a free fight between the Masons and the Catholics, during which sticks were freely used. Finally the police charged upon the combatants, and dispersed them after making a number of arrests.

OTTAWA, May 30.—Rev. W. C. Wilson, of Springfield, is here with a petition largely signed, asking the Government to reconsider its intention of the International Hallway through Springfield. Accompanied by Mr. Dickey, he had an interview with the Premier and Minister of Railways.

St. John's, Nfld., May 30.—One of the Government's schemes in the present struggle is that if Whiteaway, Bond and Watson are not unseated and no Whiteaways can be induced to support the revenue bill, is to refrain from opening the Legislature and simply issue a proclamation giving authority to the Governor in Council directing the collection of revenue as previously and to enforce this for one or two weeks, till the Whiteaways are placed in a minority. The Government will afterwards indemnify themselves. It is understood the British Government is acquainted with this proposal and approves of it.

LONDON, May 30.—The Daily News correspondent in St. Petersburg writes that the police are still arresting political suspects throughout the empire. The extent of the plot, he says, was greatly underestimated at first. Almost daily the police discover evidence of many hitherto unsuspected. More than 50 boxes of dynamite and numerous bombs have been seized on a steamer in a Russian port. They were imported for the use of the conspirators. Upon searching the Baroness Marthoff's house, the police found a list of women Nihilists most of whom belong to the higher classes of society.

CALCUTTA, May 30.—In addition to the loss of 200 lives by the bursting of a dam formed by land slip at Charkhappuri, Kulu, and the destruction of live stock and dwellings which accompanied it, disastrous floods have wrought much damage in North Coohar. The Jettings has overflowed its banks and has inundated an area of hundreds of miles. The result of the inundation has been a tremendous loss of property and it is believed, an enormous loss of life. Whole villages have been destroyed in a number of sections of the devastated country. The flood is pronounced to be the most severe in many years.
