The Transvaal War

The French Consul at Pretoria has discovered that out of goods to the value of 265,000,000 francs purchased by the South African Republic, only 8,000,000 francs worth is obtained from France. He plaintively remarks that France does not enjoy the share in the commerce of the Transvaal "which the well-known sympathy of the Boers for France ought to assure her." This looks as if the French were learning the real value of Boer professions of friendship from a practical standpoint. The British learnt this many years ago.

Responding to the toast, "Our Imperial Forces," at the annual London Press Club dinner Lord Strathcona said that this form of toast was a great improvement over the old one of "Navy and Army Auxiliary Forces," as it showed that there was an Empire, and that England alone did not form the Empire, as without the colonials there could be no Empire. The colonials, he said, recognized this, but they did not desire special praise. The men from Canada, he added, would be the last to assume they had done more than their simply duty.

Writing at Bloemfontein on March 20, the London Times' man says:—"We remain here for three weeks while the relief of Mafeking and the western attack is pressed on. Monotonously comfortable though it will be after the excitement and fighting of the advance, it is probably the least time necessary to reit the men and remount the cavalry. It is already considerably longer than "the least time necessary," but that is not surprising. The public has only begun to realize the price paid in horseflesh for the capture of Bloemfontein. It was worth it, but the price foust be paid.

Lord Roberts is now setting a high standard of work and establishing a trained school in the field which will render British officers the best and most experienced in the world. The reform is not likely to end with the campaign. Lord Kitchener may not be destined to transform the War Office and the headquarters staff, but Aldershot methods are doomed. The influence of the smart sets and the Guards' officers is undermined and arrangements will be made for field

... and battle tactics over large areas and on comprehensive lines. The West African situation is considered serious, owing to the possibility of French complications; but these are not likely to arise during the exposition period.

The following is an extract from the private letter of an officer in Ladysmith:—"Lord Ava's record since he joined Sir George White's force was indeed a grand one. He was attached to the staff of Colonel Ian Hamilton, he went in with the fighting line of the Gordons at Elandslaagte carrying a rifle; all through that night he worked, carrying down and the Boer wounded off the battlefield; he was the only man in Ladysmith not detailed for the duty who climbed Gun Hill with General Hunter, and helped to destroy the guns. On January 6th, he was mortally wounded on Wagon Hill in the fighting line of the Imperial Light Horse, who were then holding the ridge against overwhelming numbers of the Boers. I could not claim a long standing friendship with Ava, but the stirring scenes of the last six months give you a clearer insight into the character of your comrades than years of ordinary acquaintanceship can ever do, and I can truly say that a braver soldier and greater gentleman than Ava I never met.
