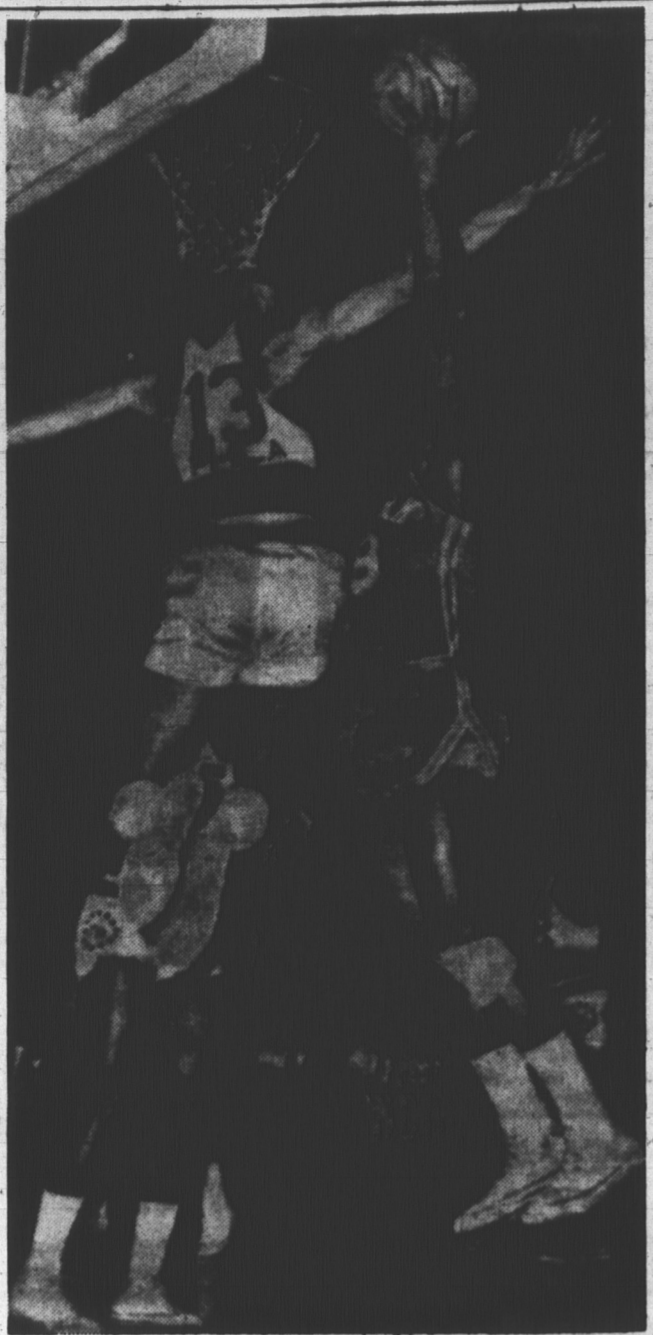
Mickey Mantle Faces Scalpel

Unknown Pro Massengale Leads Bing Crosby Open

By JACK STEINSON PEBBLE BEACH, Calif. (AP) While thousands watched others, Texan Don Massengale slipped into the lead in the \$104,500 Bing Crosby golf tournament Friday with a four-under-par 67 and a 36-hole total of 137.

He left the Monterey Peninsula Club course unaware he was ahead by two strokes for the \$11,000 first prize.

Massengale and Yancey each played the same course where most of the crowd of about 20,000 congregated to watch Arnold Palmer, Tony Lama, Billy Casper and Jack Nicklaus.

Palmer, Lama and Casper all faded in the stretch. After being five-under-par at one point, Palmer had to settle for a one-under-par 70 and a 140 total. Lama came in with a 72 for 142, while Casper lost five strokes to par on the final four holes and started a 74 for a 145 total.

Palmer, Lama and Casper started early when the greens were frozen. Nicklaus was in the final group off the tee on a sunny day and came in with even-par 71 for a 144.

Another Texas pro, Billy Martindale, and his amateur partner, Bob Roos of San Francisco, took over the pro-am division lead with a best-ball 62 and 125 net.

Messengale started his par-breaking Friday by chipping in from 25 feet on the second hole. He curled in the long putt on the 370-yard fifth and finished

the first nine with a 34. An 18-footer dropped for a birdie at the 10th and a seven-footer at the 13th. He three-putted the 16th and, went one over par and then dropped a 25-foot birdie putt on the next hole.

"My wife was waiting for me when I finished, so we just got in the car and left," he said of his disappearing act. "We didn't learn I was in the lead until we got to Pebble Beach."

Under Crosby's format, each of the 137 pros with their amateur partners, plays one round at Cypress Point, Monterey Peninsula and Pebble Beach.

On Sunday the field is cut for finals in the 72-hole tournament.

AL GEBERGER, the first-round leader with 68, tangled with the tough Pebble Beach course Friday and came out with a two-over-par 74 and a 142 total, tying Lama for fourth place behind Massengale, Yancey and Palmer.

Martindale had a 72-71-143 for his medal score and remained in the running for individual pro honors as well as leading the pro-am division.

The two pitching aces of Los Angeles Dodgers, Don Drysdale and Sandy Koufax, continued to help their pro partners in the best ball competition.

Drysdale and Al Besselink carded 62-64 for a 126 and a

second-place tie while Koufax and Ken Still were in the group at 127 with 63-64. Besselink had a 77-148 on his own ball and was helped 13 strokes by Drysdale in the second round. Still had 72-143. Both pitchers are playing with handicaps of 18 in this event.

George Knudson of Toronto carded a 70 for 144.

Horsemen Club To Hold Meeting

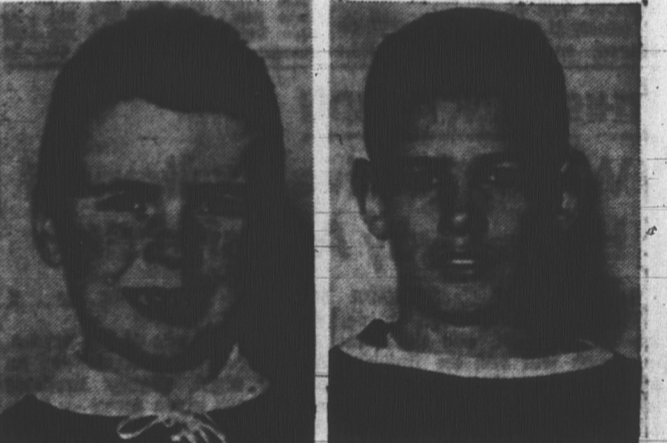
