

# Injured Construction Worker Describes Ordeal In Wreckage

OTTAWA (CP)—George Veiga has burned and scalded in an Ottawa hospital bed, counting his blessings a week after he was sure he was about to die.

Veiga, a 26-year-old construction worker who came to Canada from his native Portugal 1 1/2 years ago, was the last man to be pulled alive from the wreckage of the Heaton Road Bridge. It collapsed on last Wednesday under the workmen building it.

"I was standing still when the bridge suddenly gave way beneath my feet," Veiga said. "It seemed a long time falling."

Within minutes the pair was surrounded by a battery of policemen, doctors and rescuers with cutting torches.

For two hours the rescue team worked, painstakingly burning through the 30 or more steel rods which caged Veiga on all sides. Bucket-veils were formed to douse the red-hot rods to try and save Veiga further injury. The torches had heated the rods.

A doctor administered a morphine shot and scooped away handfuls of concrete as it rose to the victim's chin.

"The pain got worse all the time. Several times the rods seared my skin. Only I knew where the rods holding me were but I couldn't see to point them out and when I did the rescuers couldn't understand me.

"If only one of them had spoken Portuguese I could have been out in an hour," Veiga pleaded with them in let me see the torch myself."
