The question of when to draw trumps and when not to is a subject omitted to close study. Every time declarer plays a suit contract he is faced with this recurring problem, as it must not be forgotten that the great majority of contracts end up in a suit.

Unfortunately, there is no all-encompassing rule that can be effectively applied to the variety of situations the declarer is a suit contract may meet. Each hand is dealt with according to the special factors involved.

Flemming Suggests \$25,000 As N.B. Share In Relief Fund

FREDERICTON (CP) — Premier Hugh John Fleming, chairman of the board administering the New Brunswick Fishermen's Disaster Fund, said Tuesday he will recommend that the province contribute \$25,000. This would match a grant made by New Brunswick to the Springhill Relief Fund after an October mine disaster.

The fishermen's fund was created Monday by the Fredericton Daily Gleaner and Monthly Atlantic Advocate in co-operation with the New Brunswick division of the Canadian Red Cross Society. Thirty-two New Brunswick weekly and daily newspapers, radio and television stations are co-sponsors. Contributions would help families of 25 men who died in a Northumberland Strait storm Friday night.

By Tuesday night, the fund total exceeded \$20,000. Early contributions included \$5,000 each from Lord Beaverbrook, British press peer who grew up in the Miramichi area; New Brunswick industrialist K. C. Irving and the Sir James Dunn Foundation, set up in memory of the New Brunswick-born financier. M. J. Boylen-Montreal financier, and the Bathurst Pulp and Paper Company, contributed \$2,500 each.

MONEY FROM ONTARIO

A special meeting of the Chatham town council Tuesday unanimously sanctioned a \$1,000 grant as an emergency measure. A spokesman said the council will make a further donation. On Monday a \$3,000 cheque was received from the Ontario Junior Red Cross.

The Royal Bank of Canada, fund trustee, said donations were also being received at branch banks but an exact total could not be ascertained Tuesday night.

La. Gov. J. Leonard O'Brien, fund patron, said the "need is great" and appealed for support.

Various service organizations are planning benefits to raise money for the fishermen's families, most of whom were left without means of support. Few of the 18 lost boats were insured. With nets and equipment they were worth \$4,000 or more apiece.

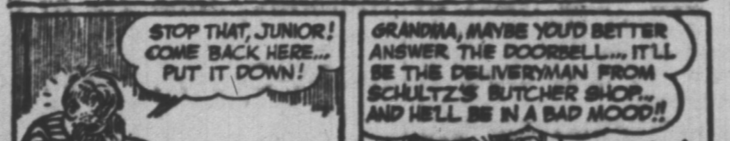

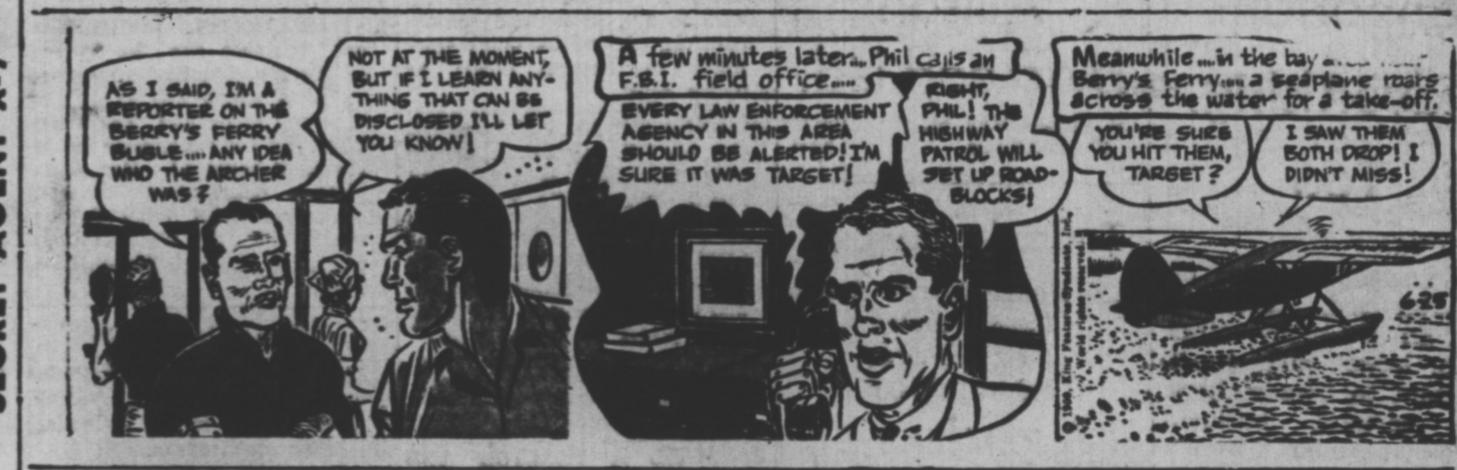
