

### Not Guilty Plea Made

HALIFAX (CP) — David Lane, 23 of Halifax pleaded not guilty to a charge of armed robbery when he appeared in Halifax police court.

Lane was arrested and charged following the May 7 holdup of a downtown Halifax jewelry store. A man held up three employees in the Barrington Street store of Leon Neima Ltd and escaped with \$136.

Lane, who elected trial by magistrate, will appear in court again May 28.

Police meanwhile are continuing to search for a second man.

### Dynamite Plot Trial Date Set

NEW YORK (CP) — Judge William Herlands set May 17 as the trial date for three American Negro men and a white French-Canadian woman on charges of conspiring to blow up United States national monuments.

Among those charged with plotting to dynamite the Statue of Liberty in New York, the Washington Monument in Washington and the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia is Michele Duches, 28, a former Montreal television personality described by police as a member of a group advocating Quebec separatism.

### Tent Caterpillar Due In Ontario

SAULT STE. MARIE, Ont. (CP) — A federal forestry official has warned that a major invasion of the forest tent caterpillar in Ontario forests is likely this year.

A survey of egg bands present on aspen trees indicates that a substantial eastward spread of the caterpillar may be experienced in 1965, said W. L. Sippell, head of the department of forestry's insect survey laboratory here.

The insects have been known to defoliate 20,000 to 25,000 square miles of Ontario forest in a few weeks.

The province's last outbreak of the forest tent caterpillar began in 1948 and ended in 1953 after severe spring weather that year. At the peak of the outbreak, in 1951, flame-throwers and blowtorches were used. The caterpillars began to reappear in 1958 and have been expanding annually.

The species is sometimes confused with the common eastern tent caterpillar which builds a weblike nest in the branches of chokeberry, apple and other trees.

### Gov't Refuses More Details On Espionage

OTTAWA (CP) — Prime Minister Pearson and Justice Minister Favreau have declined in the Commons to give additional details on the Russian espionage case revealed 10 days ago.

Mr. Pearson said the House has already been told more about this case than on other occasions.

They were pressed by New Democratic Leader T. C. Douglas and Opposition Leader Diefenbaker to answer specific questions.

Mr. Douglas wanted to know when Mr. Favreau was first acquainted with the case. When the justice minister said he could not go into more details, Mr. Douglas turned to the prime minister and asked whether Mr. Pearson thought the Commons should be kept "completely in the dark."

The prime minister said that for security reasons it was not possible to answer the questions. He said the RCMP carried out its duties "with great skill and efficiency."

Mr. Diefenbaker demanded to know whether money allegedly spent on compromising female civil servants was spent this way with the knowledge of the RCMP, under the direction of the justice minister. Mr. Diefenbaker said he couldn't believe that the RCMP would agree to using money "for this type of thing."

Mr. Favreau said only that the RCMP, one of the greatest police forces in the world, uses means of detection that are consistent with the best interests of the country.

Mr. Diefenbaker said the justice minister should answer the question to eliminate the "disable" suggestion that the RCMP uses money in a way that affects the morality of young women.

Speaker Alan Macnaughton cut off further debate. He said the rules permit the justice minister to refuse to answer questions affecting security.

### GOTA ETCHINGS FOUND

PRAGUE (Reuters) — A series of original etchings by Goya, bearing comments in the 18th-century Spanish painter's own handwriting, have been found in the library of Bradel Castle in Silesia, the Czech news agency Ceteka reported Tuesday.

### RAPACKI IMPROVING

WARSAW (AP) — Polish Foreign Minister Adam Rapacki was reported Tuesday to be improving steadily after a heart attack in April. But it will be many weeks before the 56-year-old statesman returns to his duties, a foreign ministry source said.
