Climax, not only of the coronation ceremony but of centuries of British history, was the moment when St. Edward's crown was placed on the head of Queen Elizabeth. Seconds later the silence was broken by a cry from the congregation "God Save The Queen". A trumpet fanfare echoed through the Abbey, guns boomed in Hyde Park and were echoed by those in the Tower. It was the proclamation of a new era.
