MONTREAL, Sept. 12-(CP)—Receipts were 257 cattle, 366 sheep and lambs, 1,256 hogs and 72 calves to the Montreal livestock markets today. Cattle were strong. Sheep, lambs and grass calves were about steady. Veal calves higher and hogs firmer. Three car loads of good steers were sold at \$8 with one straight load of choice steers averaging around 1,350 pounds at \$9. Medium steers were \$6.25 to \$7 and common down to \$5. Butcher cows ranged from \$4 to \$6. Canners and cutters \$3 to \$3.75. Bulls were of common to just fair quality and brought \$3.50 to \$5. Veals ranged from \$7 to \$11 with two choice veals up to \$12. Good veals were \$10.50 to \$11 with medium kinds from \$9.50 to \$10. Drinkers were \$6 to \$8 and grassers from \$4.60 to \$5.50 with bulk between \$4.75 and \$5.50. Good ewes and wethers were \$8, buck lambs \$8 and culls \$7. Sheep were from \$3 to \$4.50. Hogs were strong at \$9.50 for bacon-fed and watered. Selects drew \$1 per hog premium with the regular cuts on off grades. Light hogs were cut \$1 per hundredweight. Sows were \$6.75 to \$7.25. Hogs sold on rail grade brought \$12.60 light weight.

Prices Rise In Canada

FLOUR AND POTATOES LEAD WIDE RETAIL UPSWING IN WEEK. TORONTO, Sept. 12 (Canadian Press)—The week-old war in Europe was making itself felt today in the pocketbooks of Canadian house-wives.

Retail prices of flour and potatoes have shot up. Butter and meat prices have also risen, but less sharply. Sugar remained stationary at retail. The upswing in potatoes is said to be caused by farmers who are holding back supplies for higher prices. This has not been confirmed from any official source.

Wholesalers in some sections of the Dominion say that farmers also are holding up meat supplies and that they are able to buy only odd lots.

Prices of all staple goods from the United States have gone up because of the currency exchange. And all overseas products, such as raisins, grapes, prunes and olives, have gone up because of increased shipping rates.

A Canadian Press survey shows the following comparisons: Potatoes 22 cents a peck a week ago, now 29; pastry flour, 56 cents for 25-pound bag, now 66; butter, 25 and 28 cents, now 28 and 29; olive oil, \$1.80 a gallon, now \$3; veal pork, 21 cents a pound, now 23.
