BY-LAW REGARDING
REMOVAL OF SNOW AND ICE FROM CITY SIDEWALKS

1. It shall be the duty of every tenant or occupier of any premises in the City, or in case there be no tenant, then of the owner of such premises to keep such portion of any public walk as shall be immediately in front of such premises free from snow at all times except that it shall be sufficient to have the same free from snow four hours after the ceasing of any snow storm, if such ceases in the daytime, or if in nighttime then before ten o'clock in the day time following; and further to keep such portion of public walk free from ice at all reasonable times, otherwise to cover the same with sand, ashes or other material sufficient to give safe footing.

This By-law will be strictly enforced. Any tenant, occupier or owner wishing to procure sand for their sidewalk may obtain same at the City Barn on Pownall Wharf.

BY-LAW

TO AMEND THE BY-LAW TO REGULATE TRAFFIC IN THE CITY OF CHARLOTTETOWN (PASSED DEC. 12, 1961)

1. Section 36 of the By-Law to Regulate Traffic in the City of Charlottetown is hereby amended by striking out all words added thereto by amendment of April 11th 1961, and substituting the following:-

"Nor shall any person park or leave any vehicle on any part whatsoever of any street or square during such hours so as to obstruct or hamper the removal or other disposition of snow on such street or square; and if precautionary notice forbidding such parking or leaving of vehicles in any area or areas of the City for any period, be given in a newspaper published in Charlottetown, any such parking or leaving which shall occur in any such area and within such period except during the night next following the publishing of the notice shall be conclusively deemed to be a contravention of any prohibition of this section may be taken, transported and impounded by the City and held until the costs of so doing and a pound fee of \$2.00 be paid, independently of any penalty imposed for the offence and the City of its servants shall not be liable in any way for such taking or for any damage caused thereby."
