 Three Conferences for Local Women's Institute Presidents and Secretaries were held in November at Kensington, Parkdale, and Dundas. The attendance was excellent at each course. The seventh District Officers Leadership Course was held at the Charlottetown Y.M.C.A. March the 7th-13th. Forty delegates were in attendance. Hon. Eugene Clark brought greetings from the Department of Agriculture.
PROGRAM PLANNING
 The Second Program Planning Contest was held in February. This is one of our new and worthwhile innovations which was introduced last year. For a number of years the Provincial Women's Institute Executive have been urging branch Women's Institutes to plan their programs for the year in advance.
 In judging the twenty-one entries in the Women's Institute program contest for 1955 a remarkable improvement over the previous year was noted, in both the art and program planning contest. Neatness and general attractiveness as to design and content counted high. Originality was also valuable, but the other points were considered foremost.
 All in all the entries were good, shown to be labours of love, and it was with regret that many of them had to be left behind in the choice. Sometimes very little separated a winner from a less than one, often some little thing on the basis of those qualities mentioned above.
