The Summerside Midget baseball team won the New Brunswick - Prince Edward Island Baseball Championship at Chatham yesterday in a close thrilling game which ended 5-4 for the visitors. It was a sudden-death contest, the first game played in Summerside having been thrown out by the Maritime body. John Bethell struck out 15 Chatham batters, and gave up seven hits, two of them dropping in because of misjudgments by fielders. He walked two. Moore, Chatham flinger, struck out 6, gave up seven hits and walked two. McEachern led the Summerside attack with a single and double in three tries. Don McInnis hit two for four besides making a beautiful catch in Centre Field. Larry Hard and Irv Sonier each got a double, and Bethell a single. Irv Sonier had 2 rbi's, Bethell 2 rbi's, and McEachern 1 rbi. The game was watched by the largest crowd ever to watch a baseball game in Chatham, 1,400 paid admission, and School children were allowed in free. More than 2,000 was an estimate.
