Well Known Souris Resident, J. Frank Sterns Laid To Rest

SOURIS — J. Frank Sterns, 78, one of Souris' best known citizens, died recently in the Souris Hospital where he had been a patient for several months.

He was educated at Prince of Wales College and followed a mercantile career, first with his father and later (1923-1948) on his own in the Sterns Block, Souris.

Community interests in his younger years included membership in the Souris citizen's band (organized in 1905) and a prominent part in the artillery militia of Eastern Kings. A marksman, Mr. Sterns was a member of the Canadian Bistley team in 1913. He went overseas in 1915 as lieutenant in the Second Canadian Siege Battery, served as adjutant, was mentioned in despatches, was awarded the Military Cross and closed his army career with the rank of major. On the board of managers of St. James' Presbyterian Church, now the United Church, Mr. Sterns served for nearly 60 years; for 26 of these he was also an elder of the church.

Survivors include his sisters, Adele, Mrs. R.C. McLean of Souris; Miss Hazel L. Stearns of Charlottetown; Irene, Mrs. Alfred Dunlop at home; Winnifred, Mrs. James Gray of Ottawa, and five nieces and one nephew.

The funeral which took place Sunday afternoon from St. James' United Church was conducted by Rev. D.E. Adams. Honorary pallbearers were members of the combined sessions of St. James' and Bay Fortune United Churches. Active pallbearers were E. J. Mackenzie, Harvey Poole, M.J. McQuaid, Keith MacKenzie, Percy Clinton and Ray Leard. Interment was in the family plot of Souris West cemetery.

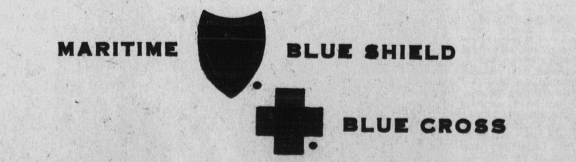
