



UNDERSIZE LOBSTERS BEING TAGGED

On a float (above) anchored in the middle of Egmont Bay harbor, incoming fishermen tie up for a few minutes while their undersize lobsters are checked and the undersize traps are turned over to biological station officials who are considering a research project to demonstrate to fishermen that lobsters do not migrate from the general area in which they are hatched.

With this information it is hoped that poaching will be eliminated, and that fishermen, knowing the lobsters will remain in the same fishing area, will return undersize lobsters to the water with the knowledge that they will grow to legal or even market size by the time the next fishing season rolls around.

TAGGING METHODS, RESULTS ARE EXPLAINED

With one of the 1,000 lobsters tagged this year in continuing a research experiment begun last year in a survey on lobster est-

mates and migration habits, Mr. Roy Murray of the Biological Station at St. Andrews, N.B., is seen above (center) at his work station on board a large float in

Egmont Bay, describing to Guardian staff reporter Roy Turner (right) the method of tagging and the results already shown by the survey which indicates that lobsters do not migrate outside of a two or three mile radius.

In support of this contention more than 600 of the 6,000 undersize lobsters that were tagged last year have already been recaptured since August 10th in the same general area in which they were released last year.

U-K To Send Rockets Into Stratosphere

LONDON, (Reuters) — Britain has revealed plans to send instrument-bearing rockets into the upper stratosphere in empire-wide scientific explorations during the International Geophysical Year 1957-1958. The Royal Society, foremost of Britain's scientific organizations, said Thursday a new technique has been developed to send radio messages from instruments back to earth from high-flying rockets, making direct observation by instruments of the upper atmosphere possible.
