### Berlin Wall Closes With Reds In Anger

BERLIN (CP-AP)—The wall dividing this city was closed again Friday night and the East German regime has threatened not to reopen it for Christmas visits.

The Communist threat resulted from anger at the fact that East German marks can be bought in West Berlin at an exchange rate lower than the one set by the East German regime.

MOSCOW (AP)—The new Krenin leadership has agreed to put off a proposed conference of Communist parties here Dec. 15 on the Soviet-Chinese dispute in favor of a Peking meeting with Mao Tse-tung's regime early next year, Communist sources said here.

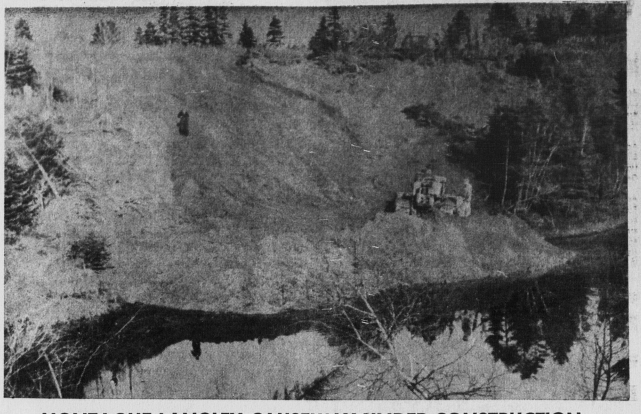
