to lose, the slam appears to be surely beaten.

Conceding defeat without a struggle can hardly be the right thing to do, so declarer puts his mind to work to see whether or not the defenders' cards can be distributed in any way that will still permit the contract to be made. The answer lies in arranging the play so that when East is handed his trump trick, he will have to return a card that allows South to salvage the heart loser.

Accordingly, after two rounds of trumps, the A-K of diamonds are cashed, a diamond is ruffed. This is the first step of the elimination plan from both hands of side suits. The elimination plan is based on the hope East is short in hearts, where the side loser exists.

Next three rounds of clubs are played. There is no certainty that East will follow to each club, but if he interrupts by ruffing one of them, the hand was probably doomed from the start.

When, luckily, it turns out that East started with five clubs, the slam becomes a sure thing. East has already shown up with three spades and three diamonds and hence cannot have been dealt more than two hearts.

The ace of hearts is cashed and East is now given his trump trick. He has two cards left, both clubs. When he leads one, South discards his heart loser and ruffs the club in dummy.
