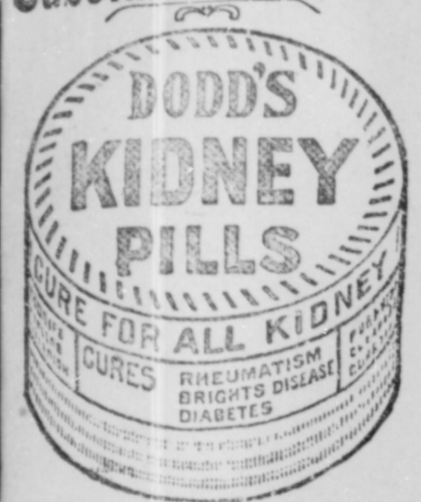

FLOGGED TILL HE DIED.

Brutal Punishment of Young Quadra —He Exposed a Plot.

NEW ORLEANS, La. April 5.—A private letter received in the city from Bluefield, Nicaragua, gives the revolting details of the death under the penal lash of a young native of the Mosquito coast, who had fallen under the displeasure of Gen. Torres, President Zelaya's grand inquisitor.

The laws of Nicaragua do not admit of death penalty in theory, and so the young man, Quadra by name, was simply condemned to be flogged, and the whipping was kept up until the youth fell dead at the feet of his executioners.

He received 251 blows from a bamboo rod before he was extinct.

The crime of which Quadra was guilty was in warning General Reyes of a plot to assassinate him that was being hatched at the time when Reyes was still at the head of his revolutionary operations at Bluefields.

But for Quadra, Reyes would have been assassinated, and as a reward Reyes made the young fellow a captain.

The whipping was done in the presence of more than 20 persons, and the whipping post is now a regular establishment in the district.

NEW BRUNSWICK GOLD.—A Fredericton despatch says: The rush for gold claims at Cross Creek keeps up and reports of wonderful discoveries reach the city almost every day. The latest alleged find is a gold nugget an inch square, estimated to be worth about \$50. The fact of the finding of gold is such an every day occurrence that the novelty of things is beginning to wear off. About 200 more claims were taken out to-day.

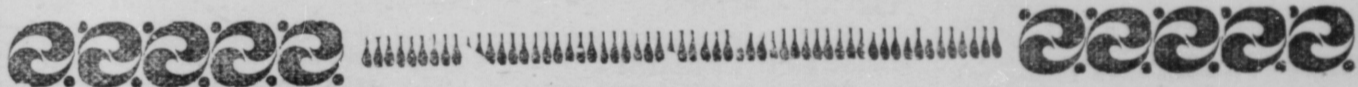
