

Manufacturers Favor Tax Cut In Canada

OTTAWA (CP) — The Canadian Manufacturers' Association said Tuesday a general tax cut would be the quickest, most practical way to increase the supply of capital for Canadian industry and help keep it competitive.

The 6,000-company association told the royal commission on banking and finance that it favors the recently-announced

their proposal for what the CMA called costly "second tier" pension plans — compulsory retirement-benefit schemes piled atop the old-age pension. This would "socialize" funds, putting them in government hands and channelling them away from industry.

Uniformity should be achieved in federal and provincial companies and securities acts to lower incorporation and underwriting costs. And in any event, underwriters' and dealers' commissions should be deductible as expenses for income tax purposes.
