The following are some employment opportunities for you to consider:

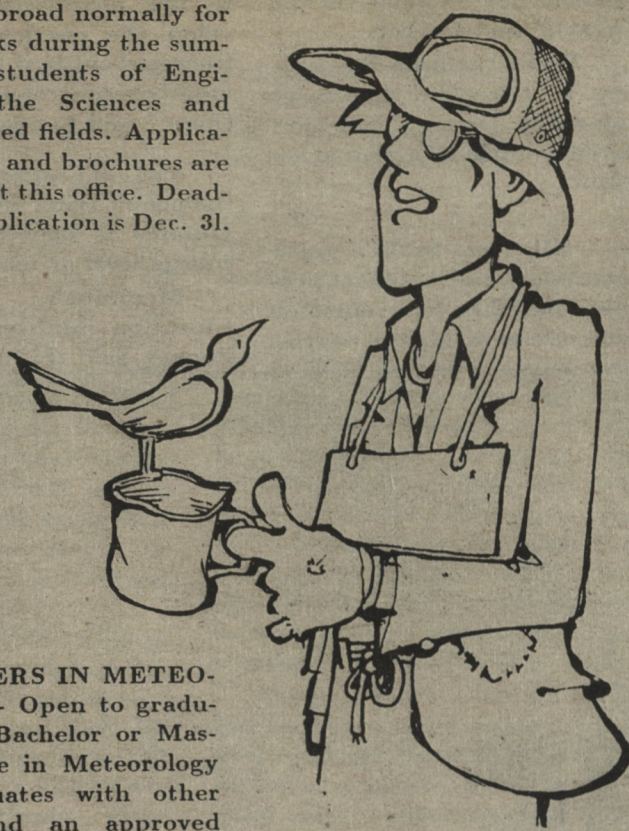
**INDIAN AND INUIT GRADUATE OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM** - University graduation with high academic standing is required. Transcript of marks must accompany application. Deadline for application - December 31, 1987. Information booklet and application forms are available at this office.

**CANADIAN POLITICAL SCIENCE ASSOC. PARLIAMENTARY INTERNSHIPS 1988-89** - The internships are open to Canadian citizens who are recent graduates of a Canadian University - from Sept. 1988 for a period of ten months - estimated \$12,000. plus travel subsidies. Applications must be received no later than DEC. 31, 1987.

**1988 IAESTE EXCHANGE** - Iaeste aims to provide career-oriented

training abroad normally for 8 - 10 weeks during the summer for students of Engineering, the Sciences and some related fields. Application forms and brochures are available at this office. Deadline for application is Dec. 31, 1987.

**CAREERS IN METEOROLOGY** - Open to graduates with Bachelor or Masters Degree in Meteorology OR Graduates with other degrees and an approved Diploma or Certificate Program in Theoretical Meteorology. Further information



is available at this office. Application deadline is December 31, 1987.

**BELL-NORTHERN RESEARCH** - Varied career opportunities are available to graduates in almost every discipline. Information is available at the Employment Centre on Campus.

## "In Search of the Green"

Hello there! There seems to be great interest in Canada Student Loan and Prince Edward Island Bursary Programs. The Department of Education puts out an information brochure that accompanies application forms. I thought I would reprint some of this information so that it might become clear to you. If you want this brochure, Student Services can supply it for you as well as the application forms. Here are some areas of concern:

### PROGRAM PRINCIPLES:

The responsibility for the costs of post-secondary education of the student remains primarily with the parent (guardian, sponsor) and/or the student.

Governments at both levels are interested in supplementing the resources of students and their families, and thus assist all qualified students in reaching their educational potential. The Canada Student Loans and P.E.I Bursary Program

is administered by the federal provincial government under an administrative criteria agreed upon by the two levels of government.

Awards are issued to students on the basis of calculated need. To determine the amount of your need, resources available to you and your family are deducted from total educational costs.

### COSTS RESOURCES = NEED

**CANADA STUDENT LOANS** - The loan portion of the award is funded and guaranteed by the federal government. The maximum available is \$105 per week of study, and the authorized loan is negotiated with a bank or other lending institution.

**P.E.I. BURSARIES** - The grant portion of the award is funded by the provincial government and is normally non-payable, unless you discontinue your course before the end of the academic year. The Bursary Program, for administrative purposes, is combined with

th Canada Student Loans Program. The maximum available is \$1700 per academic year.

### DISTRIBUTION OF AWARDS:

**TWO TERMS/SEMESTERS** If you are enrolled full-time for an academic year, the award is normally apportioned as follows:

1. The first \$2400 of need is Canada Student Loan.
2. Normally the next \$1700 of need is P.E.I. Bursary.
3. The balance of need to the maximum allowable is Canada Student Loan.

### ONE TERM/SEMESTER

1. The first \$1200 of need is Canada Student Loan.
2. Normally the next \$850 of need is P.E.I. Bursary.
3. The balance of need to the maximum allowable is Canada Student Loan.

### PROCEDURES IN ISSUING AWARDS:

The usual sequence of events when you apply for assistance from PEI Student Aid is as follows:

We will acknowledge receipt of your application if you complete the card enclosed with the form.

An initial review of your application will be carried out to determine your eligibility with respect to resident status, dependant or independent status, the institution you plan to attend, course of studies, etc.

Assuming you qualify in all areas and the required information/documentation is complete, the Student Aid Branch will assess your application and notify you accordingly, stating your tentative need, and issuing a Canada Student Loan Certificate of Eligibility.

The Certificate enables you to negotiate a loan at a Canadian Chartered Bank or other approved lending institution. You are required,

to maintain all your loan accounts at one branch.

In most instances, an Earning Verification Form will be forwarded with the Canada Student Loan portion of your award and immediately after enrollment, you will be required to verify your work term earnings by completing the form and providing the Student Aid Branch with official proof(s)
