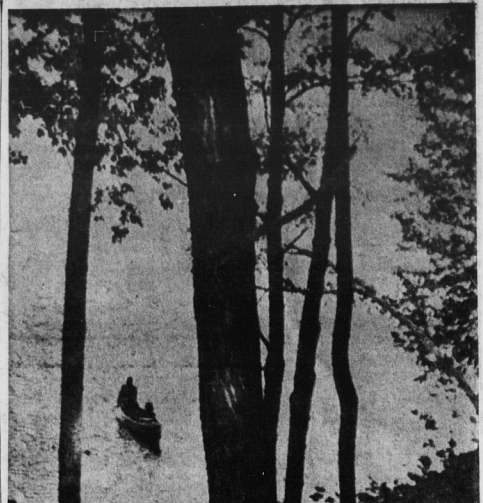

BALTIMORE (AP) - Baltimore Orioles set two major league club fielding records during the 1963 season and shortstop Luis Aparicio established one American League mark, according to unofficial statistics.

The Orioles made 99 errors in 182 games for a fielding percentage of .9838. The previous record of 100 errors and a .9811 percentage were set by Cincinnati Reds during a 154-game schedule in 1958.

Aparicio obtained last winter in a trade with Chicago White Sox, made 13 errors at shortstop while playing in 144 games.
