The Allen steamer *Nestorian* which arrived at Halifax, from Liverpool, G. B., on the 30th June, reports having passed large quantities of ice off the Banks of Newfoundland, and was detained off the harbor twenty-six hours on account of dense fog.

Her Royal Highness the Princess Louise, His Excellency the Governor General, accompanied by Lady Pelly, Lord Campbell, the Hon. Mrs. Langham, Hon. A. Yorke, Colonel McNeill, Lt. Col. DeWinton, Captain Harbord, Captain Chater, and Dr. Boyle, are now up the Grand Caspédia, angling, but information as to the extent of their success has not been received.

Despatches from New York state that on 27th inst. fully 100,000 flod from the city in consequence of the heat, which had caused 224 deaths from sunstroke on that day 178 of the cases being children under 5 years of age; on the 28th there were 30 deaths, several of them children. Glen Island, Beckoway, Conoy Island, Long Branch, and the Hudson river were the favourite points with the escaping citizens. The heat was about as oppressive at night as during the day.
