

# Tighter Controls Proposed Over Drug Testing In U.S.

WASHINGTON (AP)—The U.S. government has proposed a series of new regulations to control over-drug testing.

One key proposal would give the Food and Drug Administration authority to halt a test if "a substantial doubt" developed as to the safety of the drug.

The proposed new regulations, which will not go into effect for at least 90 days, were announced by Welfare Secretary Celebrezze.

They were drafted in the wake of widespread concern over the sedative thalidomide, which has been blamed for thousands of birth malformations, and President Kennedy's statement that "we ought to be tougher" with new-drug rules.

Celebrezze said the proposed regulations were drawn with the dual purpose in mind of protecting the public against risks while at the same time "imposing no unnecessary restrictions on the conduct of investigational research."

The new rules would require: 1. That the food and drug administration be put on notice and given the full details about the distribution of drugs.

2. That clinical investigations, involving human patients, be based on adequate preclinical studies in animals.

3. That the clinical investigations themselves be properly planned, executed and supervised by investigators, and that the Food and Drug Administration be fully informed during the progress of the investigations.

Present regulations do not require either an initial notice to FDA of a clinical trial of a new drug, or subsequent reports on its use.

# TWO MEN CROSS CHANNEL IN CAR

DOVER, England (AP)—Two Frenchmen crossed the English Channel in an amphibious car. It took them 8 1/2 hours to cover the 21 miles.

The men were Tony And, 42-year-old Paris night club owner, and Jean Broel, 45. Paris was their destination.

Despite heavy seas and high winds they drove across in their amphibious car from the sandy beaches of Calais.

The channel was last crossed in an amphibious car in 1835 by two Germans who took 7 1/2 hours in a specially constructed vehicle.

# Rockwell Home, Ducks Queries

BOSTON (AP)—George Lincoln Rockwell, self-styled leader of what he calls the American Nazi party, arrived by air from London Thursday but ducked questions on details of his short visit to England.

Rockwell was deported from England as an undesirable after attending a meeting of the British National Socialist Movement at a Gloucestershire camp.

The Nazi leader was the first off the jet plane but all the other passengers had been cleared by the health, immigration and customs officers half an hour before Rockwell was released. He said his trousers were ripped while he was being searched by the customs agents but declined to give any details of the search.

# Tristan de Cunha Group Leaves To Survey Island

SOUTHAMPTON, England (Reuters)—Tearful kisses and prayers sent an advance party of 12 persons off to the bleak volcano-ravaged island of Tristan de Cunha to find out whether 270 homestead refugees can go home again.

The hand-picked group boarded the liner *Stirling Castle* heading for Cape Town, South Africa, and then to their south Atlantic island which was torn by a volcano last September.

From Cape Town, the 12 will travel some 1,800 miles due west in two trawlers, accompanied by a colonial office official.

One of the returning party, 26-year-old bachelor Albert Glass, said the group had to make the island habitable again "because none of us fit into the pattern of 20th-century life in Britain, with its continual rush, noise, television and money."

He added: "Back on the island we help one another. If you are out of a hunk of meat, then you kill a sheep or you ask your neighbor for what you want."

The advance party hopes to round up cows and sheep, repair damaged homes, plant crops and have the island ready for the main party's return by Christmas.

LIVE IN RAF CAMP  
The Tristans now are living in a former RAF camp outside Southampton.

Johnny Repetto, 26-year-old brother of Chief Willie Repetto, the island population's leader, headed the advance party.

He said he understood that some of the lava had flowed into the sea to form a natural breakwater off the main beach.

One young islander, 20-year-old Michael Rogers, will not return. He fell in love with an 18-year-old English girl and hopes to marry soon.

"I hate Tristan," he said, "because of giving him his unconditional love."

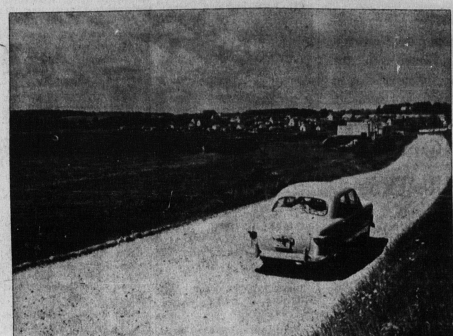
