Portfolio of Justice Offered to Mills.

Fishing Bounty Checks—Mowat to be Governor of Ontario.

OTTAWA, Sept. 28.—Sir Wilfrid Laurier has offered the portfolio of Justice to Hon Mr. Mills, and is waiting the latter's reply. Sir Louis Davies has decided that in future fishing bounty claims will be handled by an officer of the department who will be responsible to the department. Sir Oliver Mowat succeeds Kirkpatrick as Lieutenant governor of Ontario in the course of a few weeks.

BERLIN, Sept. 28.—The Prussian police are on the track of a powerful anti-dynastic movement in South Germany, which includes many members of the best families.

A Disastrous Riot.

GIRARDVILLE, Sept. 28.—As the outcome of a quarrel over the Latimer shooting, a riot took place here yesterday between a mob of Poles. Thirty six were shot and stabbed; nine will die.

English Cricketers Beaten.

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 28.—The English cricketers were beaten by the Philadelphia eleven with three wickets to spare. Another match has been commenced.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL

LONDON, Sept. 26.—The Daily Mail laughs at the report of the Canadian expedition in Hudson Bay hoisting the British flag over Baffinland to get ahead of the Americans, and declared that the territory has long been a British possession.

MONTREAL, Sept. 26.—By virtue of his descent from the eldest nephew of the first Sir William Pepperell, Bart., of Kelly, Maine, Harry W. S. Pepperell, of 92 University street, has assumed the title of baronet and has filed his papers at the Heralds College in London.

BOMBAY, Sept. 25.—Recent advices from the scene of the wreck of the bridge of the Bangalore Mysore railroad, near Madur, indicate that 150 persons succeeded in making their escape. Most of those killed and injured are natives. The train, which was crossing the bridge at a considerable rate of speed, has been entirely submerged by the waters of the river.

LONDON, Sept. 25.—The extent of the cricket craze here finds evidence in the farewell banquet given to Prince Ranjitsinhji, the popular Indian cricketer, at Cambridge, on the eve of his departure on a cricketing tour to Australia. The seven hundred guests present included the mayor, aldermen and college dons, and when the prince retired to his hotel the vast crowds assembled beneath his window, called him out and cheered him to the echo.

LIMA, Peru, Sept. 25.—The latest news received here from Carabaya gold district indicates that the stories of the gold finds have not been exaggerated. This news is contained in a letter from a prospector written from the head of the river San Juan bearing the date of Aug 12 in which he says that in one particular place the amount of gold extracted was almost past belief and he is sure that a small fortune can be secured in that small spot alone.

PARIS, Sept. 25.—The Politique Coloniale publishes a despatch from St. Petersburg, today, saying that as a result of an exchange of views between the chancellors of St. Petersburg, Paris, Berlin, Vienna, Rome and Constantinople, the Sultan of Turkey will shortly address the powers on the subject of Great Britain's evacuation of Egypt, and Russia, supporting the Sultan, will invite a conference at Constantinople or St. Petersburg, with the object of settling the question on the basis of the autonomy of Egypt, under the suzerainty of the Sultan.
