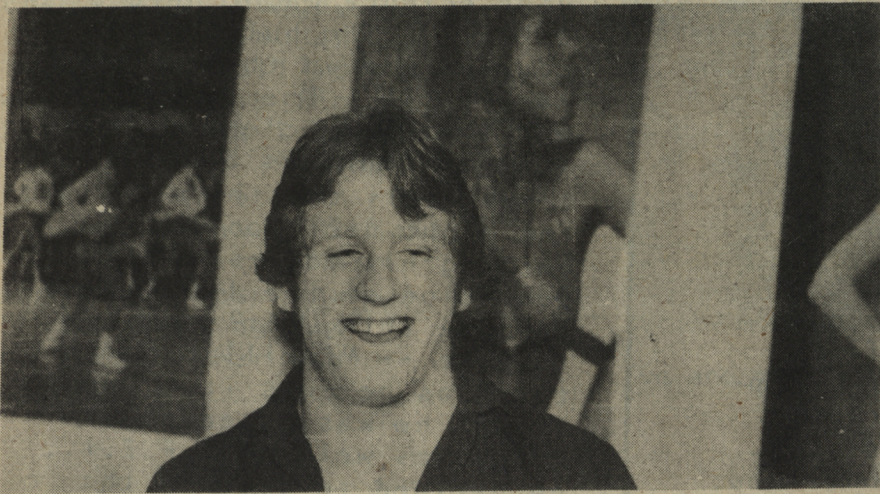


# ROBERT MacDONALD: STUDENT AT LARGE

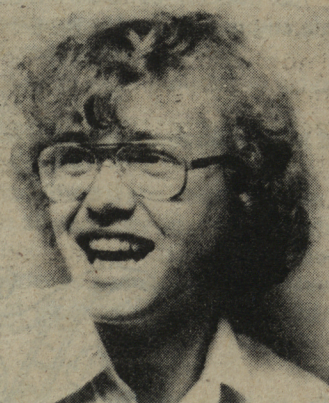
