N. B. FIRE REPORT

FREDERICTON, Sept. 29 — (CP) Fire has taken 29 lives in New Brunswick so far this year and caused property loss of \$1,774,821 up to the end of June. Provincial Fire Marshal G. M. Young said today. Loss of life is the highest of any year since 1938, when 38 deaths occurred. Property damage was \$393,388 more than during the first six months of last year.

PUSAN, Korea, Sept. 28 — (Sunday) — (AP) Korean police have killed or captured 48 Communist guerrillas in a campaign begun recently to halt attacks on government trucks and supply routes in Southwestern Korea, the Home Ministry said today. Police estimated about 200 Reds still are operating in the Taebaek Mountain of the southwest.
