Morning Stock Letter

(Received over Pittfield and Co's Private Wire)

NEW YORK, April 8—The only important news this morning is that the Radco plan has been declared operative. Foreign exchanges are about the same. Dividend meetings scheduled for today are Woolworth and Continental. Stock market action yesterday could hardly be considered unfavorable. The reaction was in comparatively small volume. We would look on the first thing this morning and if volume again is small on any reactionary tendencies would buy some of the leaders. In connection with the utility, it is interesting to note that the first of several proposals of municipal ownership of the electric utilities in Wisconsin's election was defeated when Sheboygan voted against acquisition of the plant of the Wisconsin Power and Light Co. Official returns were 7,699 to 1,345 against municipal ownership to be financed by a \$1,200,000 bond issue.

MONTREAL, April 8—B. A. Oil—Encouraging news of the company operators was given shareholders at the annual meeting of British Am. Oil Co. Ltd., by the president, A. L. Ellsworth. The president reviewed operations of the U. S. subsidiary and estimated net earnings from this source for 1935 at about \$1 per share on the Canadian share capital. He pointed out, however, that the company would not have this amount available in cash for transfer to Canada as funds would be required for furthering of the producing end of the business. Directors were liberal in the distribution of dividends in the past and would continue this policy for the future.

Should United States operations be as favorable as anticipated and nothing unforeseen occurs in Canada, shareholders could reasonably hope for a bonus distribution on their shares at the end of the year. Total daily allowable production from U. S. wells approximately 15,000 barrels. Original interest of B. A. Oil in the new Oklahoma city field was in 170 acres of which 25 owned outright by the company and a half interest held with Midway Oil in 145 acres. Nothing was paid for the joint lease, B. A. Oil financing the drilling of wells and with the well coming into production Midway was to pay half the cost. After B. A. Oil acquired 25 additional acres in the centre of the field owned 100 per cent with exception of working rights.

NEW YORK, April 8—General Motors Sales—General Motors March sales to dealers; in U. S. 182,418 against 116,762 in February and 132,822 in March year ago. March sales to all dealers in the United States and Canada together with overseas shipments totalled 2,872,121 against 144,874 in February and 169,302 in March last year. Sales to consumers in the United States for first quarter 1936 were 379,950 against 258,093 in corresponding period last year. Sales to dealers in the U. S. in first quarter totalled 410,314 units against 301,256 in same quarter of 1935. Sales to all dealers in the U. S. and Canada together with overseas shipments in first quarter 500,167 units; against 380,716 units in first quarter 1935. Sales to all dealers and U. S. and Canada plus overseas shipment exceed every month since June 1929. It was also the best quarter since the third quarter of 1929.

Brazeur and Macassa were the strongest of the gold milling stocks, the former gaining 25 cents and the latter 17 cents while gains of 2 to 5 cents each appeared for Anglo-Huronian, Pamour, Pickle Crow, Red Lake, Malartic, Little Long Lac and Reno. Buffalo-Monkier was a soft spot in the group, dropping 15 cents and Conlarium, San Antonio, Wright Hargreaves and Hollinger were down narrowly. Hargreaves touched 7.60 in the early falling. Dome gained 1-4 and McIntyre and Lake Shore were steady.
