Believe Ancient Jaw Discovered

JAKARTA, Indonesia (Reuters)—The jaw of a pre-historic adolescent, which may be older than the remains of the oldest known man, has been found in central Java, Antara News Agency reported Wednesday. Dr. P. Marks, a geologist working at the faculty of technology at Bandung, found the jaw on the bank of the Tjemoro tributary of the Solo river, about 20 miles north of Surakarta. The latest find, he said, was possibly older than the famous "Java Man"—half ape and half man—whose jaw and cranium were found on the bank of the Solo river in 1890.

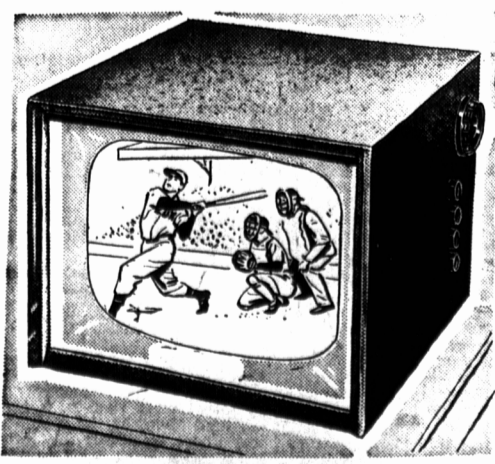
