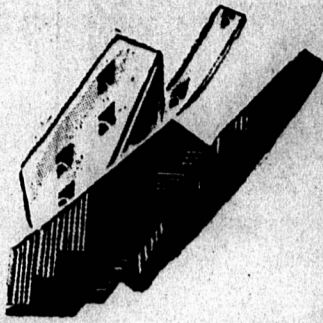

NATO Airmen Establish Peacetime Precedent At Summerside, P.E.I.

Siemon, air officer commanding training command at Trenton, Ont. Alberton-west Prince Bd. Of Trade Opposes Brief

Following is the text of a brief filed Monday for the Alberton-West Prince Board of Trade with the Legislative Committee on Transportation:

"Alberton and West Prince Board of Trade, being a body organized to advance the commercial, industrial and civic interest primarily of West Prince County and of the Province of Prince Edward Island in general, has given consideration to the proposals of the Canadian National Railway Company for substitution of bus service between Tignish and Summerside and abolition of the present morning mail and passenger service from Tignish to Summerside.

"Having in mind that the present morning mail and passenger train service is inadequate for the needs of the citizens of West Prince and that it has been inadequate for a number of years and having given due consideration to the proposed bus service to substitute the present mail and passenger train service, the Alberton-West Prince Board of Trade has given due consideration to this proposed substitute bus service.

"And having in mind that West Prince County has a large rural population and that the proposed bus service will not give transportation service to the large rural areas now being accommodated by the present morning train service because the route over which the Canadian National Railway Company is seeking the right to operate is exactly the same route now travelled by the Island Motor Transport Limited, which will constitute a duplicate service on this route.

"Having in mind that there are on the Canadian National Railway line, nine booking stations and sixteen flag stations between Summerside and Tignish, many of which will be eliminated entirely by this new proposed bus service, thereby causing great inconvenience to the travelling public of West Prince County where the mail and passenger service is now in operation. As a matter of fact, according to the proposal of the Canadian National Railway Company, at least one village through which the Island Motor Transport Limited, now operate, a bus will be eliminated entirely by the new proposed bus service. Only five stops will be made by the proposed C. N. R. bus operation, thereby eliminating

"If a license is granted to operate the proposed Canadian National Railway bus service, it will certainly not improve transportation facilities in West Prince County but will, on the other hand, prove to be a great detriment and inconvenience to a large majority of the people living in the area of West Prince County.

"The Alberton West Prince Board of Trade has taken into consideration the fact that it is the intention of the Canadian National Railway Company, to operate their buses on the main highway but the situation in West Prince County is such that only a small percentage of the public will be accommodated if the proposed C.N.R. bus service is put into effect. We have, of course, considered the fact that the proposed C.N.R. bus service will be controlled by provincial laws and regulations but regardless of this fact, we feel that the proposed service will prove to be so inconvenient to the travelling public in this part of Prince Edward Island, that we are compelled to oppose the granting of this license for the proposed bus service to the Canadian National Railway Company.

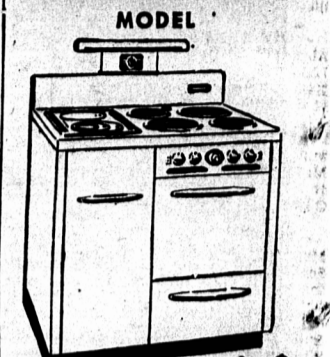

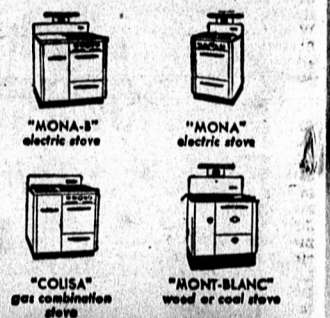
