ON AND AFTER JUNE 1ST, 1906 BIRTHS occurring in the Province of Prince Edward Island must be registered within 30 days of their occurrence.
DEATHS occurring in Charlottetown, Summerside and Georgetown must be registered before burial.
DEATHS occurring in other parts of the Province must be registered within 7 days of their occurrence.
MARRIAGES must be registered in the office of the Registrar General within 40 days of their celebration.
