Marie Dionne Has Entered Hospital For Observation

MONTREAL, (CP)—Marie Dionne, one of the famed quintuplets has left her cloistered convent for medical observation, it was learned at a suburban hospital Saturday night.

Confirmation that the 21-year-old girl is in hospital at suburban Ville St. Laurent came from a nun at the Roman Catholic institution, Sister Marie Legarde.

Sister Marie told a reporter the girl is under observation but was unable to provide further details.

It was learned earlier Saturday that Marie left her cloistered convent in Quebec Wednesday to visit her sisters at the Ville St. Laurent, where they are training to be nurses, but no further details were known. It was the second time the tiny quintuplet interrupted religious life because of ill health.

Marie first entered the convent—La Congregation des Servantes du Tres Saint Sacrement—as a postulant in November, 1953. She left because of ill health some eight months later, before her sister, Emilie, died in a Laurentian rest home following an epileptic seizure.

Religious officials at the convent—known in English as the Order of the Servants of the Blessed Sacrament—said Saturday Marie left Wednesday to visit her sisters Cecile and Yvonne, who are taking nursing training at Ville St. Laurent's Notre Dame d'Esperance Hospital. Officials at the hospital, however, said repeatedly Saturday Marie stayed there only one night and they did not know her pre-

sent whereabouts. They said Cecile and Yvonne were "on duty" and could not be interviewed. Olivia Dionne, father of the quintuplets, was quoted as saying at his home near North Bay, Ont., that Marie had entered the hospital because she was "run down."

The other surviving quintuplet, Emilie, is a music student at Nicolet, Que.

The sisters, who habitually try to shun the limelight that has sought them out since birth, embarked on their various careers after the death of Emilie in August, 1954.

Marie's family said she left Quebec suffering from "loss of appetite" and travelled to Montreal with a nurse. It was reported she would remain at the hospital for a month under observation.
