Taxpayers' Ass'n In Full Swing After Meeting

It has been decided that an associated of Charlottetown taxpayers will be formed with the purpose of studying local taxes and to be of benefit generally to the citizens of the city.

The decision came at a meeting of taxpayers committee, formed last month for this purpose, held in the city police court last night.

Formation date for the association was set for the second week in June with plans for the election of officers and several committees. It was agreed that the executive should consist of 12 usual officers plus five members. The committees would be organized in the same manner as those in city council.

During last night's meeting, excerpts from radio scripts on taxation, produced by the Canadian Chamber of Commerce were read by the members. All discussion dealt with what moves should be made to keep taxation within realistic bounds. A suggestion was made that an ombudsman might be of value to a city such as Charlottetown.

RCMP In Charlottetown Get New Telephone Number

A completely new telephone answering service replacing the several different numbers in individual phones now in use will go into effect at the Royal Canadian Mounted Police station in Charlottetown on Saturday, Cpl. Robert Williams said yesterday.

In future there will be only one number to call for all sections and the public is asked to make note of the new number replacing the several now listed in the telephone book. It is 382-2451.

All incoming calls at the barracks are routed through a system similar to an inter-office communications type. The deskman answering can immediately determine if the person called is in and make an instant connection. Another advantage is that once the connection is established the conversation is completely private.

Another interesting feature of the new system is that it is not necessary for any of the 13 telephones in the building to make use of the system for outgoing calls. Any member of the Force
