Paper by J. J. W. Billingsley Before the Good Roads Congress at Chicago.

Among those who have given the subject of road improvement careful attention there is a widespread conviction that the good condition of any road depends upon a system of thorough drainage—a system which embraces not only the surface of the roadway but also the water which filters through the ground and through the soil underlying the road-bed, will render the travel-way soft and springy, often affecting the compacted surface of the road, so as to cause it to break up, or, in other words, "the bottom drops out." The remedy is through drainage.

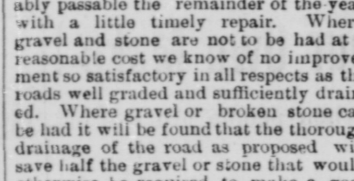

A Wagon Endgate.

A is the endgate or board. B is an iron ring 1 1/2 in. in diameter, the joint of which is shown at C. This hinge is fastened with wood screws on upper side of the bin and extends up on back of endgate to the top of the bin. The brace commonly used on frame wagon bins, bolted at the lower end and to crosspiece under the bin, and at the top end with 2 1/2 in. bolts to side bin. This brace has two outward extending flanges, as shown at D, which lock round, made of 1/2 inch round iron, and fitting loosely in holes in the outward extending flanges of the brace E, and having a pair of lock nuts, one on each end of the lock lever D over to the left, this releases the hinge B at upper end, which is now free to move back and the endgate can be easily withdrawn. H shows a button on the hinge B. This is to prevent the lock lever D from dropping down too far.

How a Queens County Man Found Permanent Healing.

The underdrains should be laid at the depth of three or more feet. The size of the tile will depend on the length of the drain and the fall, but it is probable that they should be not less than four inches in diameter in any case and as much larger as the needs may require. The three essential features named embrace two systems—the removal of the surface water speedily and effectually; the removal of the water of saturation remaining after the removal of the surface water and the prevention of the flow of soil water under the road-bed. The underdrains should have a uniform descent or grade to some natural stream or outlet, where the water discharged will flow away freely and at no time back up in the drain. The crowning of the road should be sufficient to cause the water falling upon the surface of the road to flow readily through the side ditches. If it fails to flow away and remains in ruts and depressions it will increase the amount of mud and the inconvenience of travel. Roads in such a condition should have road machines passed over them as often as necessary to make and keep the surface level.
