ATTENTION. POTATO GROWERS
The attention of all farmers is directed to an amendment of the Prince Edward Island Potato Production Act passed by the Legislature in 1962 whereby all persons planting one-quarter acre or more of potatoes must plant those of the "Certified" class or better.
Potato growers are advised to procure their requirements while stocks of seed potatoes are available.
As many producers of good seed potatoes are now disposing of their crops on the tablestock market, it should not be difficult for all farmers who grow potatoes to arrange for their seed requirements for this year.
The failure to comply with this regulation will render the grower liable to a minimum fine of \$50.00.

NOTICE
VILLAGE OF PARKDALE

THE ATTENTION OF ALL DOG OWNERS OR KEEPERS WITHIN THE VILLAGE IS BROUGHT TO THE FOLLOWING EXCERPTS FROM BY-LAW NO. 8, RELATING TO DOGS AND THE LICENSING THEREOF:—
(1) Whenever a person may become owner or keeper of any dog or bitch within the said Village, he shall report the fact—in order to have the name of the dog or bitch registered.
(2) A License Fee of three dollars (\$3.00) for each dog and ten dollars (\$10.00) for each bitch within the Village, shall be annually paid on or before the first day of May in each year by the owner or keeper.
(4a) No owner or keeper shall permit his dog or bitch to run at large outside the owner's or keeper's property.
(4b) Any dog or bitch which shall be on or about any street and not in immediate company of, or under reasonable control, of its owner or keeper, or some competent person, shall be deemed to be at large.
(10) Any Police Officer of the Village, or any person authorized by any Police Officer, shall take into custody all stray dogs or bitches, or dogs or bitches at large—and shall keep and detain such dogs or bitches for a period of seven days, during which time the License Fee . . . all Pound fees and a three dollar penalty fee shall be paid, and in default of such payment the dog shall be destroyed by the Police Officer or a person acting under his direction.
DOGS MAY BE REGISTERED, AND FURTHER INFORMATION REGARDING ABOVE BY-LAW OBTAINED, AT THE PARKDALE POLICE OFFICE DURING OFFICE HOURS. STRICT ENFORCEMENT OF THIS BY-LAW WILL BE EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.
