## Baseball Gets Congressional Warning

WASHINGTON, July 31 —(AP)—Baseball was told today that it expects to be exempt from anti-trust legislation, it has to change its thinking.

National League president Ford Frick was up as a witness in a Congressional hearing on the game when Rep. Emanuel Celler (D-NY) suddenly snapped this last on at him:

"You are so imbued with the spirit of maintaining the status quo that you are like the people who ride in railroad cars sitting backward. You don't see anything until you've passed it."

"If we exempt you from anti-trust legislation, you are going to have to reorient your thinking," Celler's comment came after Frick had tried to explain why there has been no change in the way the major leagues are set up even though the population shift has been steadily westward.
