LONDON, Feb. 6.—(Reuters)—Princess Elizabeth, a 25-year-old girl of 25, will be proclaimed Queen Elizabeth II by a Royal Decree, pending today and will fly back to London today from her tour in Africa.

She becomes Britain's first ruling Queen since Queen Victoria died in 1901 and the fifth in British history since Mary in 1553.
