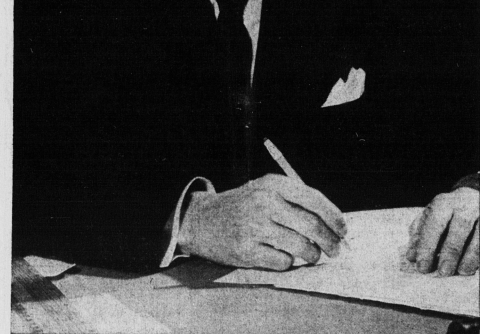

OTTAWA — The name "Charlottetown" will appear on the new Canadian dollar coin that is to be issued in 1964. Finance Minister George Nowlan announced here Monday.

The coin will be issued to commemorate the one hundredth anniversary of the 1864 conference of the Fathers of Confederation, which prepared the way for confederation in 1867.

The new coin has been designed by Dinko Vlodanovic, 42, Montreal architect from among 169 designs submitted to a panel of judges headed by N.A. Parker, master of the mint. Also on the panel was H.G. Budden of Charlottetown.

The reverse side of the coin depicts the emblem of the four national groups which form the basis of Canada's population. On the left is a circle representing the French fleur-de-lis, the Irish shamrock, the Scottish thistle and the English rose.
