# Quebec Gov't, Mining Co. Relocate Jobless Miners

QUEBEC (CP) — An all-out attack on unemployment that worked well last year at Thetford Mines now is being used at Malartic, Que., another mining town jolted by heavy layoffs.

At Malartic, the Quebec government and a mining company have each chipped \$60,000 into a fund to help relocate 100 gold miners jobless since their pit closed down.

Malartic itself and the United Steelworkers of America (USWA) have put up \$1,500 each. Federal and provincial employment services are helping out, and teachers have been brought in to give crash retraining courses.

Mining families from Wabana, Nfld., to Elliott Lake, Ont., have known the difficulties caused by layoffs, but possibly no Canadian community has ever absorbed the jolt as smoothly as Thetford Mines.

It didn't look that way last March 20 when Asbestos Corporation, Johnson's Company and Johnson Asbestos announced they were merging personnel and production facilities and would have to lay off 600 to 2,700 workers.

**SUGGESTS CORPORATION**

After a series of talks, Jean Marchand, president of the Confederation of National Trade Unions (CNTU), suggested that a corporation be formed to relocate the men.

Resources Minister Rene Levesque and company executives quickly took to the idea and each side put \$50,000 into the new corporation.

The CNTU added \$25,000, Thetford Mines \$7,000 and nearby Black Lake another asbestos centre, \$3,000.

The board of directors comprised two company men, two union men and representatives of Quebec's resources, education and welfare departments.

The corporation acted as a catalyst for all the social and employment services that could be rallied.

Three federal experts came in to counsel the laid-off miners, Quebec Hydro held two meetings on its Manicouagan development, then signed on workers, specialists gave courses on everything from auto mechanics to property assessment.

The 40 miners who decided to move to the United States were helped with visas and passports, and, like the 300 who moved to other parts of Quebec, with travelling expenses.

The corporation was finally dissolved this week after relocating about 400 of the 583 men laid off. Most of those who haven't found new jobs are considered unemployable.

**FOUND JOBS SOON**

But 94 per cent of the employable men had jobs within six months after being laid off, and social welfare services, combined with their own resources, cushioned the blow for their families.

More than half the men hadn't gone beyond the fourth grade, one-third were more than 50 years old and 70 per cent owned their own homes.

point whether his side could make five, six or seven hearts. After weighing all the pros and cons of the matter, North decided to bid six hearts.

This turned out to be a poor contract, but South played the hand well and made the slam. He took the diamond lead with the king and drew three rounds of trumps.

Aware that his only chance of making the hand lay in West's having started with eight (or nine) clubs, declarer played a spade to the ace (in order to leave Wc. with only clubs) and then led the ace and another club. When West took the club, this became the position:

West had to return a club and declarer ruffed it in dummy discarding a diamond from his hand. After playing a spade to the king, he cashed the J-8 of hearts, discarding a spade and a diamond from dummy. East, on the last trump, found it impossible to keep both spades and diamonds guarded, and South made the slam as a result.

The great value of a preemptive bid is that it eats up important bidding space and thus places the opponents in a position where they must guess what to do without really knowing whether what they are doing is right.

While preemptive bids are undoubtedly fine strategic weapons to be used as often as possible, they do occasionally boomerang and cause more harm than good. Here is such a case.
